It's holiday time once again and people, especially new Canadians will be trying to decide just where to go.
One nice trip that I enjoyed and would like to recommend to others is the one that takes you along the north shore of Lake Superior.
Take No. 400 highway north through Barrie and continue on to Highway 12 at Waukegan. No. 103 will continue on to Highway 69 and will connect with No. 17 Highway at Sudbury then on through McKerrrows, which is a little north of Espanola.
There is a woodcarver at Webwood. His small place of business is along the highway just east of Massey. That is if anyone is interested.

GOODSITES
Other places one passes through are Blind River, Thessalon and Sault Ste Marie. Just north of the Sault is Gourelais Bay. At certain times of the year the Gourelais River is noted for its big pickerel, coasters (big speckled trout from Lake Superior), and rainbow, and some nice lakers down closer to the lake.

On further is Batchawana (there is a government park there). Next is Montreal River Harbour and Agawa Bay. Sorry, I missed Pancake Bay, a little north of Batchawana Bay. There are good camp sites at these places.

Further north is Wawa (meaning Wild Goose in Indian tongue). On further is White River (the coldest place in winter).

At Marathon we are close to the water again. Further on is Terrace Bay, Rossport and Red Rock. At the latter one has to decide whether to continue on 17 or go back the other way on No. 11 which takes you through Geraldton, Kapuskasing, Cochrane, Temagami, North Bay and back home.

On the other hand if one has ample time to spare, it would be interesting to continue on to Thunder Bay, and further on to the Western provinces, then branch off into Montana, North & South Dakota, Minnesota,

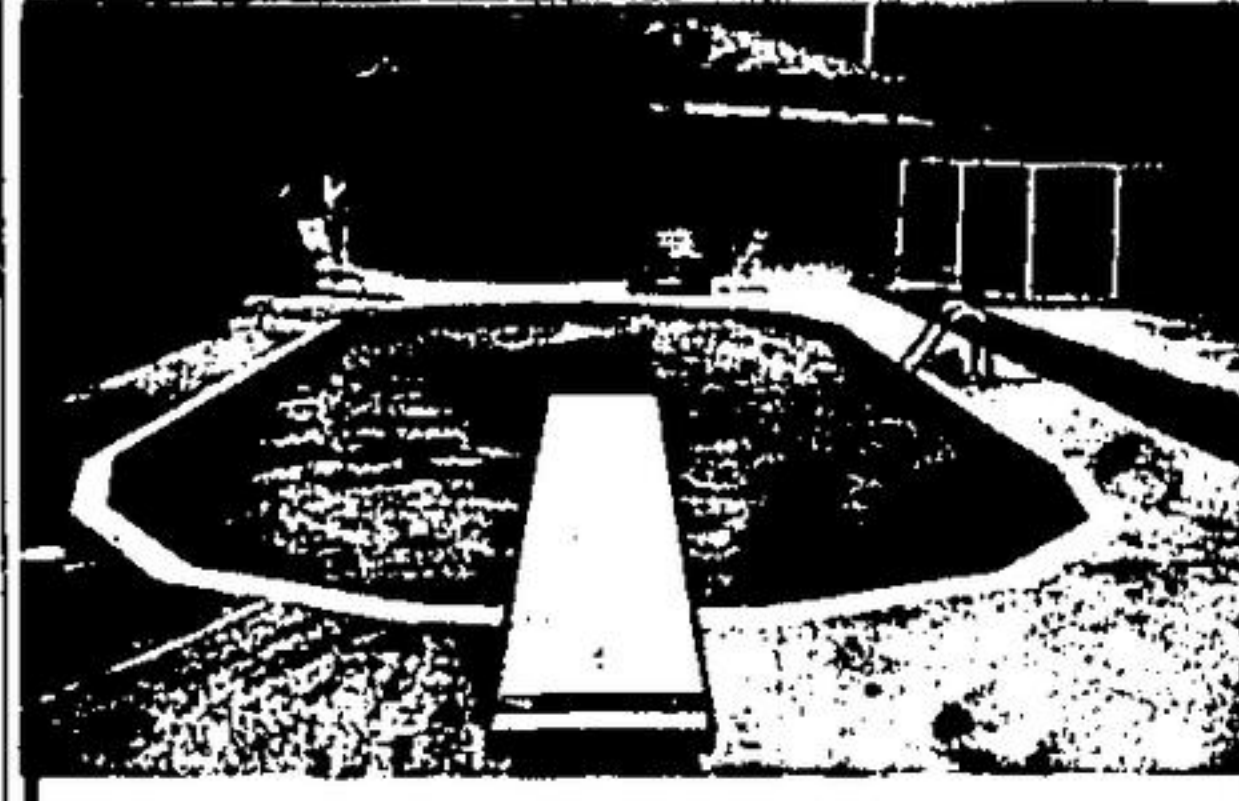
