## Elsie Bird Gathers Bouquet Of Trophies at Flower Show

The sixth annual Georgetown Horticultural Society June show was staged at the Georgetown District High School cafeteria Saturday June 19 where 267 entries were judged by Mrs. E.R. Measures of Bronte, assisted by Mrs Irvine of Oakville.

The highly successful show was the result of much concentrated planning and hard work on the part of the society's flower show chairwoman Mrs. A. Keir, the committee members and the Board of Directors.

The Eaton's Special '71 Trophy for the highest aggregate in the June show was captured by Miss Elsie J. Bird who amassed a total of 53 points. Another Eaton's Trophy for the best arrangement in the show went to Miss Bird.

The Red Rose Trophy for the best red rose in the show was won by the society's president Douglas Cole for his Chrysler Imperial Hybrid Tea Rose entry. The 1965 Directors' Trophy for the best rose in the show went to Miss Bird.

From a total of 52 entries in the peony classes, the judges selected a specimen from the entry of Mrs A. Keir as winner of the Lonson Trophy for the best peony in the show.

The Ladies' Section of the Georgetown Fair Board awarded cash prizes of \$2.00, \$1.50 and \$1.00 for the best three pink tea roses in a vase. The winners of these awards were Mrs. J. Sienko, Mrs Helene Herder and Miss Bird respectively.

The Dominion Seed House \$5.00 voucher for the highest aggregate score in the Specimen Group was won by Miss Bird while the \$3.00 Dominion Seed House voucher for the highest aggregate in the Decorative Group went to R. Pinkerton.

The commission performs a useful function for the community in compiling and disseminating statistical data for companies seeking industrial locations and in promoting sale of industrial land, some town-owned and some in private hands.
