On the issue of regional government 1,213 were opposed, 1,141 favored the political restructuring and 787 were un-decided. When asked if they would favor either a Halton-only regional setup or a Peel-Halton unit, 1,781 favored Halton-only, with 655 votes for Halton-Peel and 604 undecided.

Snow said later he found no surprises in the results. He pointed to the split as year-o evidence that there is still no rights. great consensus on regional government and that the large undecided vote showed that many people "don't understand lowering the majority age, and the complications."

Because of substantial opposition to a proposed Peel- Halton regional setup, the Ontario government has temporarily shelved the idea for this
