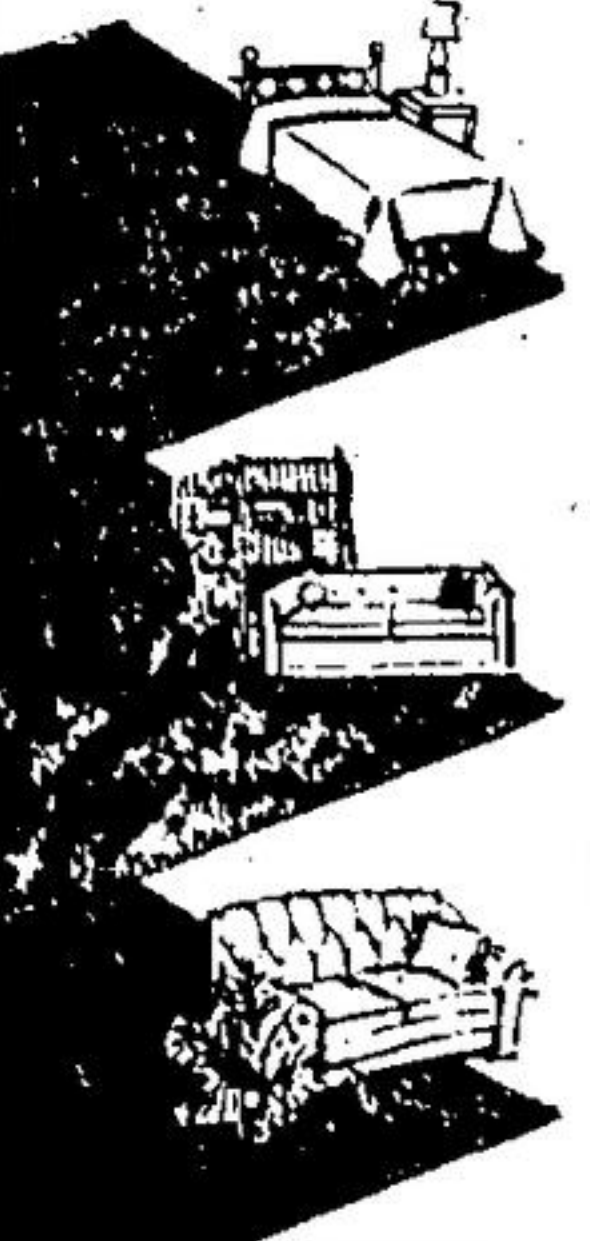

Gelok Stands For NDP

Labour leader Ken Gelok has again declared he will stand for nomination to be the provincial candidate for the New Democratic Party in Halton East.

The N.D.P. nominating convention will be held on July 13, in the U.A.W. hall in Milton. Mr. Gelok is currently the executive vice president of Local 9-593 of the Oil, Chemical and Atomic Workers International Union and also an executive of the Oakville and District Labour Council.

Mr. Gelok, a refinery operator at Gulf Oil, Mississauga, is the Oakville area vice-president of the Halton East N.D.P. Before the resignation of William Gillies as N.D.P. candidate, Mr. Gelok acted as his campaign manager.
