For a liquid seasoning I like the works, grapefruit sliced, lemon juice, or lemon slices, vinegar Smaller pan sized speckled trout are done the same way only not left so long each side to cook. Try my way some time and you

will be in for a treat. I might add that fillets of cases are reviewed each year for muskie, pike, bass, pickerel, whole perch, and smelts were also cooked the same way.
