Golden Gate Pays \$5,326 for 30' Lane

Council ended four months of squabbling, Thursday night, when they approved the sale of the 30' lane behind the townhouses on Mountainview to Golden Gate Construction for \$5,326, plus all legal and survey costs.

Al Pilutti, co-owner of Golden Gate Construction also agreed to pay \$8,280 in capital levies. This levy is based on a by-law which sets out charges for buildings said to throw an extra burden on town water and sewer services. The town retains a sewer easement through the property.

PLAYGROUND

Despite the previous hectic discussions, Thursday night's meeting was very quiet with agreement and the by-law to sell the lane passing with little comment.

Cr. Donna Denison questioned

Pilutti about playground equipment.

Pilutti explained there were two play areas, each with \$700 worth of equipment, all approved by the Central Mortgage and Housing Authority. He also pointed out that each dwelling unit has its own backyard.

Reeve Ric Morrow said he felt the play equipment should be at the discretion of council, with a cost limit set out.

"Would you go for a limit of \$2,500", asked the Reeve, as he pointed out this would not mean that amount would be spent.

Pilutti agreed.

NOT PROUD

The recorded vote proved to be unanimous on both the agreement and the sale, but Cr. Ernie Sykes commented, "I deplore the way this agreement was reached. In future we should

be sure of what we say in the beginning".

Cr. Ern Hyde agreed, saying "I feel ashamed of the way the town coffers have been swelled by over \$8,000, I'm not proud of our business dealings".

Most Show Decrease

Parks Attendance Figures Reflect Cooler Spring

Most Conservation areas in the Credit Valley Conservation Authority and the Metro Toronto Conservation Authority have shown a decrease in the number of persons making use of the facilities compared to 1970.

Both authorities attribute the lower numbers to the late spring with its cooler weather.

The Credit Valley Authority says its figures, which include statistics up to July 4, may be outdated now. They say, as does the Metro Authority that with the good weather in the past few weeks, figures may have taken a significant rise.

WILL RISE

Both said they expected the figures would rise dramatically during the remainder of July and August.

Up to July 4 in 1970 the Credit Valley Authority had 13,292 campers and 40,982 visitors at its Terra Cotta area. This year, the figures are lower at 8,449 campers and 26,592 day visitors.

The story is the same at the two other areas in the Credit Valley

authorities bailiwick. Mondora near Orangeville, showed a slight increase in campers with 1,208 this year and 690 in the same period last year. The number of day visitors is almost half what it was, however, with 2,208 this year compared with 4,202 in 1970.

Belfountain, which has no facilities for camping, showed a slight increase with 14,200 visitors this year compared with

13,868 in 1970.

The Metro authority's areas haven't shown as much decrease as the Credit Valley conservation areas. The 927-acre Albion Hills area has had 118,378 visitors this year, down only slightly from 118,755 in 1970.

The Heart Lake Conservation area has remained only slightly lower at 90,479 compared with 92,675 in 1970.

NORTH HALTON REPORT



During the week ending July 10, officers of the Ontario Provincial Police stationed at North Halton Detachment worked a total of 1,025 1/2 hours and patrolled 9,478 miles on roads under their jurisdiction. Charges were laid against 64 motorists for driving offences while an additional 30 persons received warnings for driving errors. Proceedings in Provincial Court held in Milton led to 99 convictions being registered.

During the 7 day reporting period officers from North Halton Detachment investigated 65 general occurrences. Among these were: 4 thefts, 3 assault investigations, 4 impaired drivers were apprehended, 5 investigations under the Liquor Control Act led to charges against 11 persons, 1 arson, 1 mischief complaint, 1 domestic complaint, 2 persons have been charged under the Petty Trespass Act, 1 stolen car was recovered and 1 complaint was received when a child was bitten by a dog. The many other occurrences were of a minor nature requiring little investigative time to clear.

A total of 11 motor vehicle collisions were reported to this detachment. Seven persons sustained injuries in 8 of the motor vehicle collisions while the remaining 5 resulted in property damage only. On July 10, 1971 one man died from injuries received in a single car motor vehicle collision. Total property damage was estimated to be approximately \$14,050. Collisions were attributed to: careless driving, impaired driving, fire and 1 accident occurred when a cattle beast ran into the path of a car and falling to stop at an
