


The proposed official plan unveiled at the meeting would maintain the Esquesing Township status quo, limiting growth everywhere except in Glen Williams, Norval and Stewarttown.

Consultant Keddy told those present, "In my opinion there is no percentage being big." Hatepayers who addressed the meeting, however, said they felt the plan which halts strip development and limits the location of new homes outside the villages to estate type developments with a minimum of 1,800 square foot homes, would create ghettos. People building smaller homes would have to locate in the villages.
