The Earthworm The common earthworm is a Intercounty

Leathery Cuticle The skin of the earthworm is a

leathery cuticle, secreted by the cells that lie just beneath it, and through which the animal breathes. If it dries, it hardens, and the worm dies.

The snout is at the front end of the body, with the mouth just below it. Each segment of the body after the first has four pairs of retractable bristles, or setal. that are used in the animals locomotion or progression over or under the ground.

An enlarged portion of the body, at about the 32nd segment and extending back for 5 more segments, is called the clitellum: it produces most of the mucus that is used by the earthworm to make the cocoon for the fertilized

Each earthworm has both male and female glands. In mating, sperm cells, are exchanged at the same time, then the mucus is worked forward over the head, picking up both eggs and sperm cells as it travels. Young earthworms hatch, feed on food particles within the cocoon, then break out of it to wriggle away.

Seven Feet In North America earthworms may reach 14 inches. Glant earthworms in Australia have

been found measuring seven feet. The value of earthworms to some birds - especially robins and to the woodcock, which makes about half of its dlet earthworms - is quite high. Earthworms have been found in stomachs of 44 species of birds by animal food - habits investigators. Earthworms are also eaten by fishes, toads, frogs, snakes, turties, and by various mammals - shrews, skunks, and the armadilio, but especially by several species of moles.
