### Housekeeping Units at Ukrainian Camp

Esqueuing council gave the go-ahead to Steven Kuz of the Ukrainian Youth Association last Tuesday night to build 10 housekeeping cabins on a 50 acre site to be purchased adjacent to the present camp on the 4th line of Esqueuing. The cabins may only be lived on from May till October, and cannot be leased or sold separately. The Ukrainian Youth Association has operated a children's camp for many years, but wanted to extend the area to provide a larger park and picnic area. The offer on the 50 acre MacDonald farm was conditional on obtaining a building permit for the housekeeping cabins. For Parents Kuz explained that the cabins would be used to house parents

up for the week-end to visit their children. Cr. Dick Howitt asked if this would constitute a change of land use. Reeve Tom Hill said it wouldn't, since MacDonalds had operated a picnic recreation area on the property for some years.

Approval for the same number of housekeeping cabins was given earlier in the year, but this new plan simply moves these cabins farther over to the new area. The Sun is classified as a star.
