Esqueuing Introduces Culvert Fee

Esqueuing council introduced a \$12 culvert fee Monday night, when they passed a by-law making the permit mandatory.

The \$12 permit will be necessary before a building permit is issued, so it will be applicable to everyone, creating a new entrance-way to their property.

The permit fee was contained in a by-law prohibiting the obstruction of culverts and ditches. The fee does not cover the cost of the culvert, which must be bought by the property owner. The township will maintain the culvert and replace subsequent ones when necessary.

"It looks to me as if everyone will have to pay the \$12 culvert fee, even if they don't need a culvert," commented road superintendent Bud Snow.

Council made no comment as the by-law was given the three readings, since it had been discussed in committee.
