Zeller's Aim For October

Zeller's 67,000 sq. ft. store in Georgetown Market Centre was completed at the end of August, when the store fixturing began, and should be open for business in October.

"It's a tight schedule" said Jack Reynolds, real estate manager for Zeller's Ltd., "but we have a reliable contractor and

landlord in Gallagher Construction and S. B. McLaughlin". Reynolds remarked on the splendid co-operation Mayor Bill Smith and council extended him and his company, and the broadmindedness of merchants and the Georgetown Chamber of Commerce in backing the extension of business hours, which

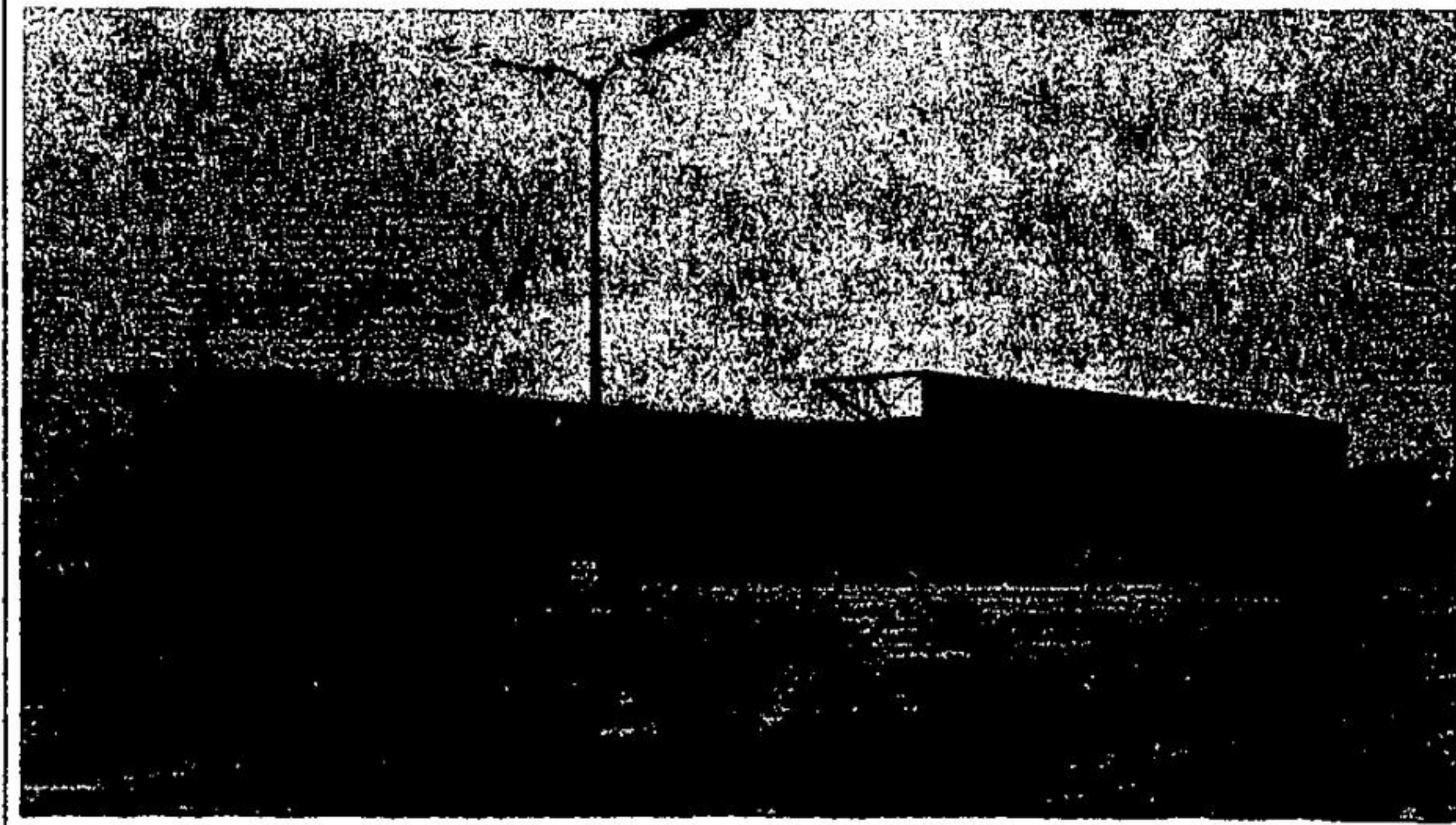
made it possible for Zeller's to consider a department store here.

He claimed the inclusion of a department store in a community tends to satisfy the needs of the consumer so that it isn't necessary to shop out of town.

In addition to Zeller's there will be 20,000 sq. ft. of new stores

The developers eventually intend to create an enclosed mall when future stores are constructed along the rear of the 20,000 sq. ft. and the existing stores. Parking for 1,000 cars will be provided at Georgetown Market Shopping Centre.

Naturalists Dedicated To Protect Environment

The Georgetown and District Naturalist Club executive has been very busy this summer. In May they met once a week and then once in June, July and August.

Twelve members of the club attended the Niagara Escarpment study at Kelso sponsored by the Halton Region Conservation Authority, where they were invited to speak for Georgetown area in regards to the preservation of the escarpment. A representation also attended the Esqueving planning board meeting and spoke there. The club as a whole has been active in hikes and various other activities throughout the summer months. In this day of awareness, the G.D.N.C. have taken many steps in providing a better environment, instituting action by personal representation and letter writing campaigns.

"Things have gotten to the point where, to enjoy nature and

its beauty, you must do more than your supposed share in order to protect it" says Bob Ollivier, vice president of the club. "Three years ago we were only enjoying the out of doors, now we have to fight to protect it."

The club's news letter, edited by Dr. Roger Frost, of Park Street professor at Erindale College, U. of T. reflects this strong feeling. Georgetown is making herself known across Ontario, as the club members keep up their constant campaigns against all forms of pollution and destruction of our wild-lands. A submission to the Quebec Hearings drew much applause from the people from across Ontario that were in attendance. Members include professors, teachers, psychologists, in fact all manner of people and all ages. A junior division will start this fall.
