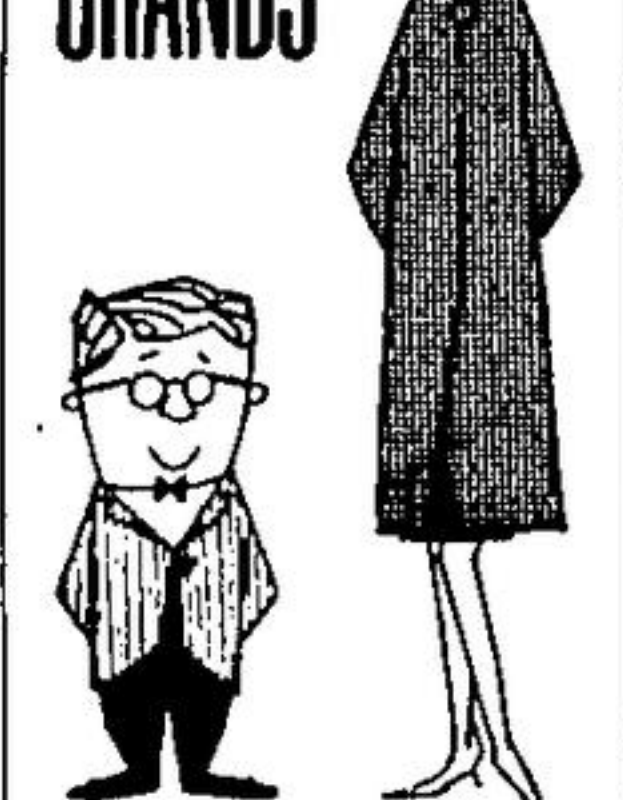

**Allow One
Pylon Sign
Veto Second**

Permission for a pylon sign on
the highway side of Canadian
Tire's new location in
Georgetown Market Centre was
granted by council Tuesday.
But there is no guarantee that
the sign will be permanent.
Council has been considering
legislation which would ban all
pylon type signs and regulate
others, particularly on highway
frontage.

Request for a similar sign on
the Mountainview entrance to the
tire store's property was refused
PUSSYFOOT
Three councillors, Reeve
Morrow and Crs. Denison and
Smith opposed allowing the sign,
which carried on a 6-3 recorded
vote.

The reeve said council is
"pussyfooting" in voting for a type
of sign which a majority oppose.
Cr. Joan Smith said it is unfair
to allow a sign which Canadian
Tire could move to another
location, while more localized
firms would be stuck for the
expense if they erected one, only
to be told to take it down later.

NOTFAIR
Cr. Ern Sykes observed that
pylons are safer for motorists,
who can see them without looking
sideways.
And Cr. Ern Hyde said
business people have to be
considered, and a blanket veto on
signs would not play fair with
them.

**Seven More
Backyard
Swim Pools**

A drop in housing starts,
during August was reflected in
the number of permits issued.
Only three permits with a total
value of \$75,900 were issued for
houses.

Swimming pool construction is
still booming, with 7 more issued
last month, bringing the total for
the year to 71 pools built in the
town. The cost of pools is
averaging out at \$2,500.

SCHOOL
A new resource centre and all
purpose room at Harrison school
accounted for \$130,000, bringing
the total of all permits for the
month to \$241,326. Fees collected
for the month amounted to \$756.
Since the beginning of the year
the town has collected \$13,581 in
permit fees, while the value of
construction reached \$4,641,235.
