Hornby's Jim Day on Fall Equestrian Team

Hornby's Jim Day, a 25 year old equestrian, has been named to the team to represent Canada in the fall international horse show circuit, which includes the Pennsylvania National Horse Show in Harrisburg, Pennsylvania; The Washington International Horse Show in New York, and the Royal Horse Show in Toronto.

Rated the strongest ever fielded by this country for the fall circuit Canada's nine member equestrian team was announced Sunday following the National Show Jumping Championships in Aurora.

NEW DEPTH

Selection was based on points amassed over eight events in the Rothmans Grand Prix series, which was used not only for selection purposes, but to develop new depth in both horses and riders.

Day, aboard Sundancer, owned by Sam-Son Farms, Hornby, placed second in the \$10,000 Rothmans National Grand Prix, feature of Sunday's championships.

FAULTLESS

Following two rounds over an

international style jumping course, Day was tied with Pan American gold medalist Jim Elder, who had ridden three horses with only four faults each.

In the jump-off which followed, Elder managed a clear round aboard the Immigrant, owned by Toronto's Bill McLachlan, in 4.19 seconds.

Day's time on Sundancer was 42.1 seconds, also in a faultless round leaving him in second spot.

SQUAD

Rounding out the Canadian squad for the upcoming international competitions are Jim Elder of Aurora, Torchy Millar, Montreal; Barbara Simpson from Calgary; Tom Gayford, Captain of this year's Pan American gold medal team from Gormley; Moffat Dunlap of Newmarket, Ottawa's Ian Millar, and Harold Banister and Eleanor MacCowan, both from Edmonton.

In 1969, Day was a member of the Canadian team which won the Prix des Nations at the Royal Winter Fair, and in 1970 he was third in the Fault and Out competition at the Pennsylvania National Horse Show, aboard All Canadian.
