## Dangerous, Steep Hill Worries Delegation

A sizeable delegation headed by Arthur Lorrman of R.R.1 Glen Williams, told Esquing council Monday night, the 10th line road was in a dangerous condition, resulting in five accidents this year.

"There are no signs warning of the sharp curve, and only one small one saying there is a steep hill", Mr. Lorrman explained.

He produced photographs showing the condition of the road, and the front of a house damaged by a car.

Cr. Len Coxe, chairman for the evening in the absence of the reeve and deputy-reeve, asked Don Telfs, consultant engineer, to outline the plans for this road. Telfs, with the report on this road in his hand, said it would be a costly job, which would take much planning.

### THERE FIRST

The proposal would re-align the road to take it farther away from the houses, and flatten the grade to reduce the steep hill. He pointed out land would have to be acquired from Sheridan Nurseries.

"Sheridan shouldn't even be considered when lives are at stake", reported Lorrman, "we were there long before Sheridan".

## Sky Jumps, Stunters Thrill Rubbernecks

Close to 11,000 people had kinks in their necks Monday morning. That's how many stared skyward for almost three hours Sunday afternoon watching everything from World War I Sopwith Pup to experimental aircraft in Brampton Flying Club's second annual air show at their Victoria field.

But despite the spectacular aerobatics and precision flying a hit of the show turned out to be a skeleton-like contraption called a Breezy built and flown by a former Georgetown man, Lionel Hamilton. Little more than a wing and an engine on a skinless frame it resembled the Kitty Hawk. But Hamilton proved there was no reason to doubt its flying ability as he circled the field several times.

The pilot sits at the front completely exposed to the elements tip to toe, and thus its name.
