## Bowling Green Awash Every Heavy Rain

A 16 member delegation from the Georgetown Lawn Bowling Club, headed by spokesman Harry Moss complained to council of flooding on Edith Street and the consequent flooding of the lawn bowling green and their clubhouse.

"We have been flooded five times this year," said Moss, "and the foundation of our clubhouse is starting to deteriorate. It seems nothing more than a maintenance problem to us, since the five catch basins in the area are not working, but nothing gets done", he stated.

**REPLACE SEWERS**  
 Cr. Harry Levy said a study of the overall design and cost estimates to replace the storm sewers in the area showed the

costs to be close to \$100,000. He hoped the work could be done in the next year or two. He said a temporary repair job involving 200' of connections would cost \$2,000.

"We have to decide whether to do the repair job or hold off for the complete job", he explained.

 Cr. Donna Denison said she understood the problem arose from the fact the storm sewers hadn't been cleaned for years, causing the silt to harden like concrete.

Deputy-reeve Art Speight urged some action to be taken immediately to save the clubhouse, which he termed "the oldest building in town".
