Teachers Accept 'Same Package' Reshuffled

Halt county's 826 secondary school teachers last Thursday voted to accept almost exactly the same offer they rejected in June.

"It's the same money package, but distributed differently," said Georgetown trustee Ernie Bodnar. "Now the people with fewer years experience get their increases earlier," he explained, "in other words we've taken from the top and put it at the bottom."

The increase effective retro-active to September 1, amounts to an over-all 7.4 percent hike. The brief letter from the President of District 9, O.S.S.T.F. Tom Ramatarsingh of Georgetown told the Board of Education the teachers supported the recommendation of their District 9 executive. It concluded by stating the teachers

would now discuss working conditions and quality teaching with the Board.

SALARY RANGE
The new settlement gives group one rate salaries from \$7,100 annually for first year teachers to \$12,200 for teachers with 11 years experience. The group two spread is \$7,500 to \$13,000 at 11 years.

Group three teachers would begin at \$8,300 and reach \$14,700 for those with 13 years teaching experience. Group four goes from \$8,800 to \$15,800 for those with 14 years experience.

The rate for principals begins at \$20,500 and allows for four increments of \$750 to a \$23,500 maximum.

DEPARTMENT HEADS
For vice-principals the figures range from \$17,500 to \$20,000 in three increments of \$700 and one of \$400. Neither principals nor

vice principals can get more than their maximums with a post graduate allowance.

Major department heads would receive additional annual pay of \$1,950, minor heads \$1,150, and assistants \$900.

Trustee Ernie Bodnar pointed out that 25 percent of the teachers in the county fall into one of those three categories.

Co-ordinators range from \$17,750 to \$20,000, assistant co-ordinators \$16,500 to \$18,000. Increments for both would be \$500.

OTHER BENEFITS include an allowance of \$500 for recognized post graduate degree, two-thirds, of the present basic OHSIP, and OHSIC rate paid by the board; and one-third of the present extended health care and group insurance rates to be paid by the Board.
