There are public washrooms, and staff washrooms and large lounge.

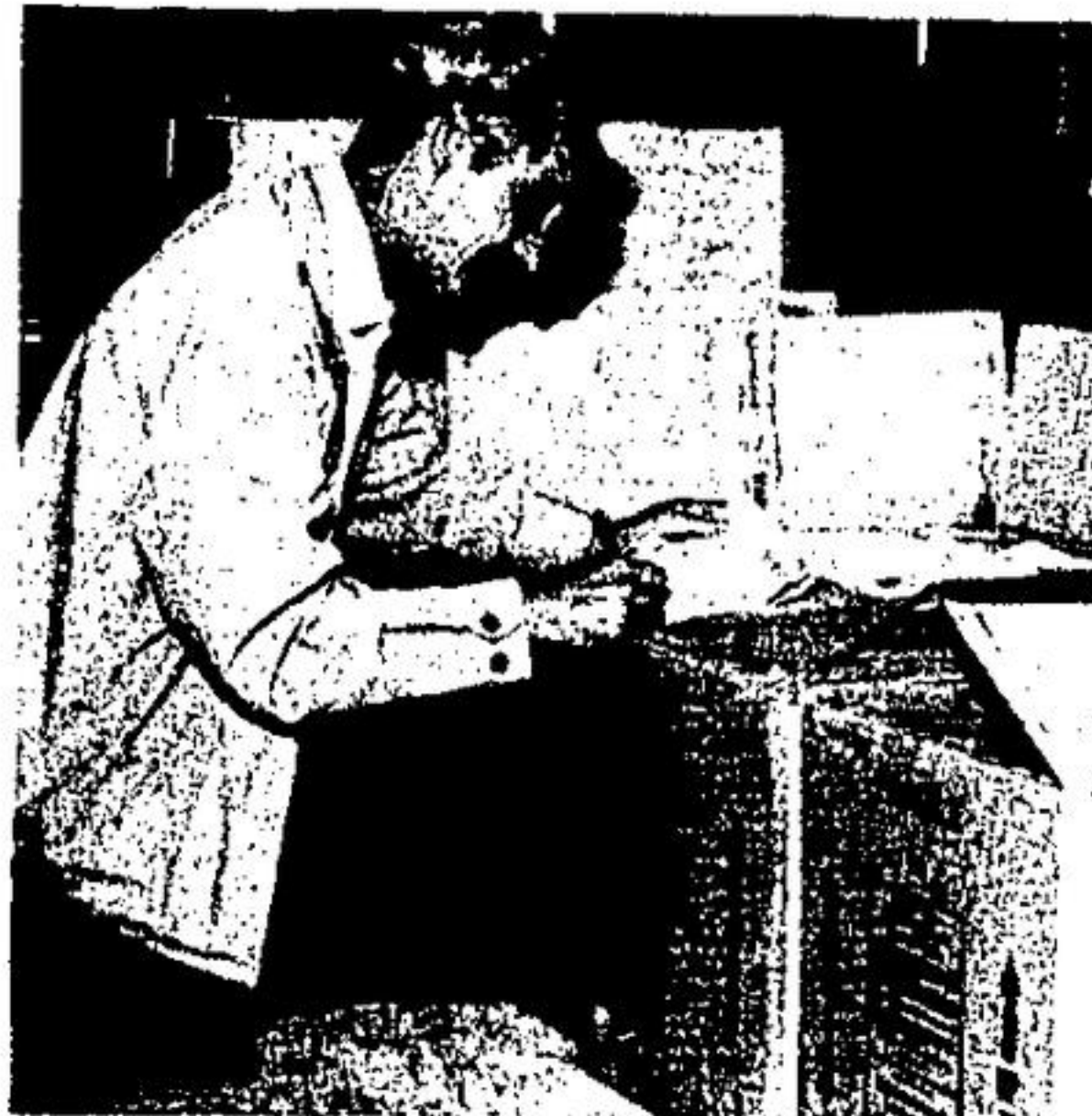
A small printing shop supplies the store with their own pricing and display signs.
