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Halton West Candidates Speak to Audience of 250

Halton West's three provincial election candidates won friends and influenced people in Acton Monday night with campaign oratory and non speeches.

Minister of the Environment George Kerr and his two challengers, Liberal Bob McNutt and NDP Walter Mulkeiwich wound up a Chamber of Commerce meet-the-candidate session in harmony on one point. Their mutual decision to forgo three-minute summations drew warm applause when announced by chamber chairman Roy Goodwin.

The voluntary sacrifice of platform exposure was made to liberate 250 listeners for coffee, doughnuts, and the 10 p.m. TV debate by Premier Bill Davis, Liberal Bob Nixon and NDP Stephen Lewis.

The 75-minute confrontation at Acton district high school capped a day of main-streeting for all

three campaigners. Robert Little, public school students fired questions in separate interviews at the school library. Not all the enquiries were political.

KNEE-HIGH
Kerr, Halton's first provincial cabinet minister fielded a surprise query from a knee-high political scientist. "What," she asked "do you think of the Women's Lib movement?"

Mulkeiwich and McNutt, both teachers, were quizzed about the personal views of the sitting member, and each other. Kerr drew similar questions.

The candidates were accorded a courteous hearing by a mixed crowd including a record number of young people, some well below the new voting age.

It was an orderly meeting, thanks to Chamber planning and restraints and the mood of the audience. Hazing and hot air were minimal and just one candidate was interrupted in his five-minute opener.

BIG SIGN
Mr. Kerr who drew the number-two talk slot continued giving an account of his stewardship as member and Minister without acknowledging a derisive: "You should live in Nassagaweya" from Bill Johnston, R.R.4 Rockwood.

Johnston boasted later that he had the biggest election sign in Halton, a 50-foot outdoor work of art, soliciting NDP votes.

Another Nassagaweya critic, taking advantage of question

time to quizz the Environment Minister about unemployment insurance benefits drew a reminder from the chair that this was a federal issue.

F. W. Moss, however, made his point that he had waited 10 weeks for unemployment benefits. Mr. Kerr promised to discuss his problem after the meeting.

SLUMS
Questions from the floor ranged from press censorship to Ontario Housing and education.

Student council president, Hank Wissen asked the candidates views on "barrack-like" homes being built by Ontario Housing Corporation "slums of the future".

Also from the student line-up Muriel Holmes, 16, asked the PC standard bearer why a new school built at Eden Mills went into discard.

"Why build it in the first place, if it was not going to be used?"

LOADED
Bill Johnson R.R.4, Rockwood, deplored Nassagaweya Township's lack of representation on Halton County Board of Education.

Mr. Kerr's reminder that the township shares a trustee with Acton (Tom Watson) brought this rest from the education critic: "It's like having Quebec's Premier Bourassa speak for his province and Ontario. Taxation without representation!"

Acton high school guidance counsellor Brian Skeritt lobbed a

loaded question about the rights of teachers to sit on the school boards. He argued as new legislation makes 18-year-olds eligible to serve as school trustees, why not accord the same privilege to the teaching profession?

The proposal won unanimous support from geology professor Bob McNutt and NDP high school teacher Walter Mulkeiwich. Mr. Kerr gave qualified approval, after scoring at the expense of his platform colleagues to the effect: "In view of my opponents occupations, I should not agree to having teachers run for office!"

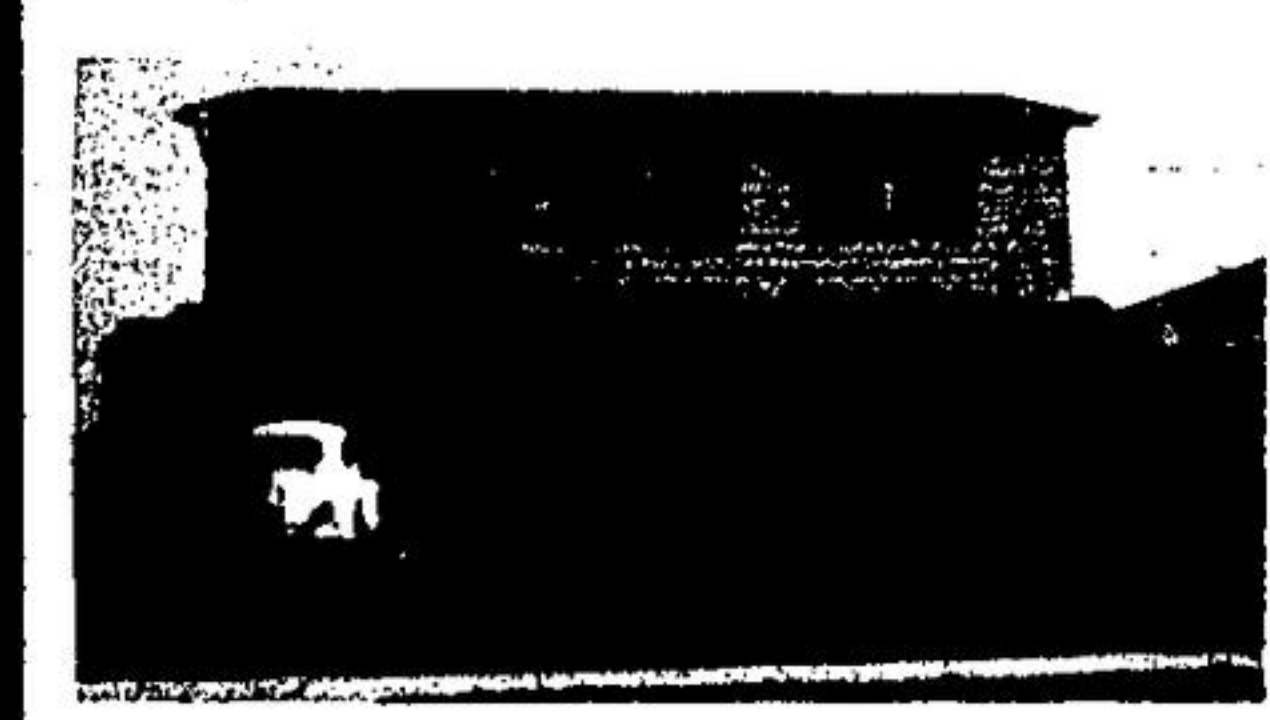
