Our "Y" at the present time, has no building. It rents an office at 7 Wesleyan St. (Eaton's Order Office is on the corner) and is open Monday to Friday afternoons from 1:30 to 5:30. Our staff consists of a program director and a secretary, both of whom work part-time.

"Where do you have your programs, with no building?" We have what is referred to as a "decentralized "Y". This means that we run our programs throughout the area. You may recall that the Central "Y" in Toronto was recently sold and the programs taken to the more highly populated areas. This may work well for the "Y" in Toronto where there are a large number of recreational facilities, schools and churches, however in Georgetown we are simply running out of space suitable for conducting programs. In accreasingly obvious that our population has out-grown existing recreational facilities.

* 37 CLASSES Our 1971-72 program brochure lists 37 classes with a possibility of three more being added, plus any additional classes for which there may be a demand.

The "Y" conducts programs in the High School four evenings a week. 
