What IS Perfect Joy?

HOLY CROSS CHURCH There is a famous story about Saint Francis of Assisi and his disciple Brother Leo. Francis and Leo were walking along the road, and Francis said to Leo, "Brother Leo, do you want to know what perfect joy is?" Of course Leo did because he loved Francis and treasured all his words.

Then Francis toldhim that to have the power of working miracles or to possess all wisdom, or even the gift of preaching that would convert the whole world, would not be to have perfect joy. "Rather," he said, "suppose at the end of the day, we should come to our friary—wet, cold, dirty and hungry—and the doorkeeper should say to us. 'Get out of here.' That would not yet be perfect joy, Leo. But perhaps the doorkeeper would also refuse us food and water. That still would not be perfect joy. And suppose the man began to curse and call us idle and miscrable and foolish. That still would not be perfect joy."

Now I think that we do not understand this story unless we see Francis and Leo walking down the road, doubled up with laughter, and with each sentence, laughing more and more.

Then Francis continued, "Suppose the doorkeeper beat us on the head and called the friars to beat us. That still would not be perfect joy. And if he called the police and had us thrown in jail so that everything we had was taken away from us" (and I think he said this with an enormous burst of laughter), then, Brother Leo, this would indeed be perfect joy, for then we truly would have nothing to glory in save the cross of Jesus Christ"

Why should anyone laugh and say, "It is perfect joy to experience

Why should anyone laugh and say, "It is perfect joy to experience rejection and immense pain?" Are we to think that the pain of Christian experience is some perverse masochism? No, the laughter of Francis is the laughter of a man who is truly sane. It is profoundly

joyful to go to the cross, with all that it implies, because it is then and there alone that we find Christ. If we seek to save our lives, to store them up and hoard them, to deal them out very carefully and prudently, we will lose them. We will lose them because we fail to recognize who gives them to us and why. In our caginess and prudence we will be alone. We will wall

ourselves in from all our brothers and sisters, and, in the very end, from God. We will lose everything.

But if we lose our lives, spend them and throw them away, as it were; if we "foolishly" give them over to Jesus Christ, we will find them. We will find them because we will find Him Who is the Lord. He is our life. It is Jesus whom we were meant to love. It was He who was meant to live in us. It is He who will pour out the life we want, in a measure which we can hardly begin to grasp. And thus it is because we find Christ by taking up our cross and following Him on the way that He walked, that we find perfect joy.
