

## Lucknow Burial For Georgetown Pilot

A Burlington businessman, and Georgetown resident for the past nine years, Gil Milton Ruston, was buried in Greenhill Cemetery in Lucknow following a service in Knox Presbyterian Church here September 21.

Mr. Ruston, 33, died when the Harvard airplane he was piloting crashed at Stratford.

He operated Ruston Mobile Homes in Burlington, commuting from Stevens Crescent.

Born at Grand Bend the son of Frank Ruston and Pearl Wanner, he received his elementary education at Kinkora, and later attended Stratford Collegiate in Stratford.

On April 29, 1961 he married Audrey Stanley in South Kinloss Presbyterian Church in Lucknow.

An experienced pilot, Mr. Ruston had been flying for 12 years. He also enjoyed hunting, golf and camping.

Beside his wife and parents he leaves sons Todd, nine, Dean, eight, and daughter Melinda, two, and six brothers, Keith of Seaford, Bill of Alberta, Neil of London, John of Windsor, Patrick of St. Paul's, and Larry of Stratford.

Reverend Norman Young conducted the funeral service. Pallbearers were George

Stewart of Burlington, William Plank of Brampton, Merrill McBride of Milton, Sidney Boser of Oakville, and Bill Treaven of Freelon, and Bob Smith of Burlington. Donald Seyd of Dundas and Alfred Mitchell of Georgetown were honorary pallbearers.

## Georgetown Y News

# What Does the 'Y' Do With Its Money

In last week's Y News we discussed the physical aspects of the Georgetown YM-YWCA. This week we are telling you exactly what the Y does with its money. Let's do it by answering frequently heard questions.

"Where does the Y get its money?" We do this several ways; through our annual fund raising campaign (last year \$6,000 was raised of which half came from residential contributions amounting to only fifty cents per house); through membership and activity fees; through a grant from the town (the first time this year); and for the first time we have received contributions in memory of a well known Georgetown resident.

"Don't you get funds from the National YMCA and YWCA?" On the contrary, each local "Y" is assessed an allocation based on income, through which we support the National YM's and YW's. The National "Y" feel, and rightly so, that if a town will

not support a "Y" then it doesn't need one. Thus each "Y", to put it bluntly, is as good (or as bad) as the people of the community make it. (When one sees the magnificent million dollar Owen Sound "Y" and a population of 18,000 — one knows what can be done!)

"What do you spend the money on? You have no building to keep up!" True, we have no building, but we must rent and operate an office. We pay our part-time program director and our secretary, who works 5 afternoons a week. We rent facilities for programs (fortunately for our budget we have the use of the high school free, as well as the Cedarvale kitchen for children's programs, instructors are paid; equipment is bought

(one small gym mat costs fifty dollars); transportation is paid for (i.e. buses for out of town activities); plus several areas mentioned further on in this column.

"Why do instructors have to be paid? Can't you get people to do it voluntarily?" We pay our instructors because this is the way we get well qualified, experienced people. A program is only as good as the instructor makes it. These instructors are responsible for turning out each week, in spite of weather, personal life, baby-sitting and transportation. In addition, they frequently attend upgrading courses at their own expense and spend time preparing their programs.

"You get a lot of money from program fees; some of your classes are awfully expensive!" Fees are kept as low as possible — children's programs are frequently subsidized. Judo costs 45 cents for an hour and a half, children's gym activities cost 25 cents an hour. Day camp, with transportation deducted, costs only two dollars a day.

We feel adult programs should pay for themselves. A couple who are "Y" members can take part in Badminton and Volley-ball for 2 1/2 hours for about 50 cents. It costs ladies 60 to 90 cents a class for physical fitness and Yoga students pay about a dollar a class. Where else can you do so much for so little cost!

"Do you spend money on anything else?" Yes, indeed! It is "Y" policy that no children shall be turned away because of financial difficulties. We sponsor children of low-income families in many programs. This summer (with the help of several local service groups) thirty seven children attended Day Camp who might otherwise have had no holiday at all! Last spring 25 local young people received free training in baby-sitting. An important, but unheralded free "Y" service, is the Leadership Training Program for teenagers. A total of 30 local young people in the past year, who were trained by the "Y" in the art of leadership, worked for the Recreation Commission were counsellors at our Day Camp or are assisting with "Y" programs. Several each year, are sent out of town workshops and camps.
