Adjustment Committee Members Will Get Salary

Members of Committee of Adjustment will be paid a salary of \$440 a year, with \$10 deducted for each meeting missed, starting in January 1972, council decided at Committee meeting Monday night. For the remainder of this year they will be paid \$10 per meeting as they have in the past.

Finance Chairman Reeve Ric Morrow said he arrived at the figure by basing it on the number

of meetings held last year, then upping it a little from the \$10 figure, making it an average of \$13 a meeting, he estimated. The reeve stressed that his aim in setting a salary was to know the maximum amount for budgeting.

Cr. Phil Siddall said he didn't like the punitive approach, and suggested a fee per meeting, but with a maximum ceiling.

Cr. Donna Denison compared

Reeve Morrow was doubtful about the deductions, he said the members do a fair amount of work outside meetings. "I have seen the chairman going around neighbourhoods asking questions when a problem came up."

This prompted Cr. Hyde to suggest the chairman of the board should be paid more. The reeve said he had approached the chairman on this subject and he refused to take any more than the other members.

George K. Greensward Was Brampton Native

Burial in Stayner Cemetery in Stayner followed a service in the Harold C. McClure Funeral Home in Georgetown October 15 for George K. Greensward who died October 13 in Riverdale Hospital, Toronto. He was 57.

Reverend Robert Scrivens of St. John's United Church, Georgetown, conducted the service. Joe Hall Jr., John McDonald, Gordon Shoebridge, and Robert (Zeke) McCandless of Georgetown, Vern Kirby of Glen Williams and Charles Royce of Huttonville were pallbearers.

The son of Albert Greensward and Annie Frances Cousins and a Brampton resident until his enlistment in the Canadian army in 1942, Mr. Greensward had been a Georgetown resident since 1945. He attended public and high schools in Brampton,

and had worked for Dale's and Calvert's greenhouses and Malton Aircraft. He had worked at Smith and Stone Limited in Georgetown since May 20, 1947.

He served with the Irish Regiment of Canada in the United Kingdom and Mediterranean area until captured in Italy September 28, 1944. He was released April 27, 1945.

On August 8, 1941, he married the former Evelyn Sanderson in St. George's Anglican Church in Georgetown.

Mr. Greensward enjoyed bowling and horseshoes, but in recent years particularly loved walking and meeting and chatting with other walkers. But above all he enjoyed vacationing at Georgian Bay.

Besides his wife, Mr. Greensward leaves a daughter Carole (Mrs. Larry Lalonde) of Georgetown. He was predeceased by a son, Barry Roy, in 1951.
