The contents of a first aid kit was discussed at the meeting and members were asked to bring items and assemble them for the Unit.

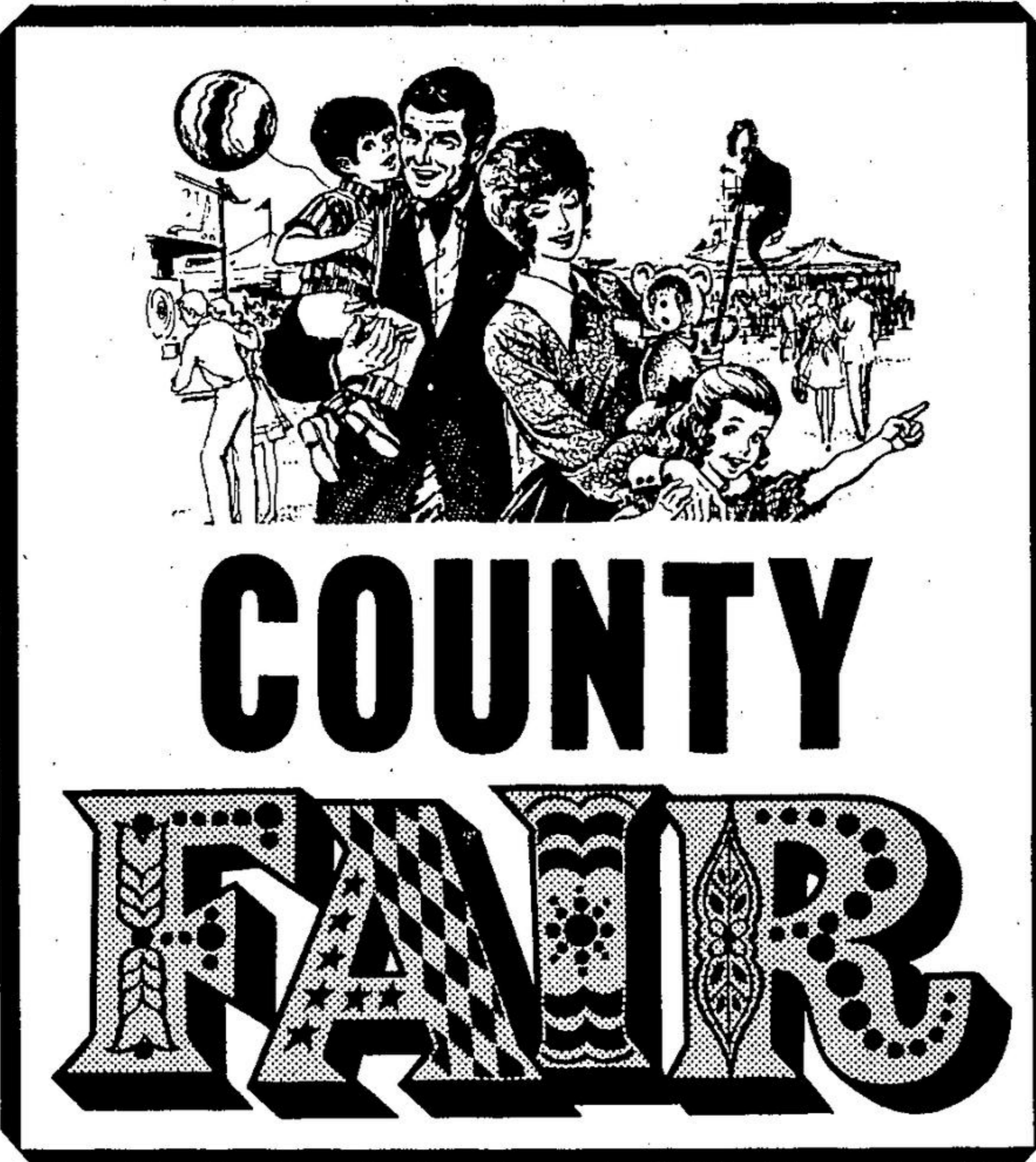
Mr. F. W. Shortill was able to return to his home after a short stay in hospital at Georgetown.

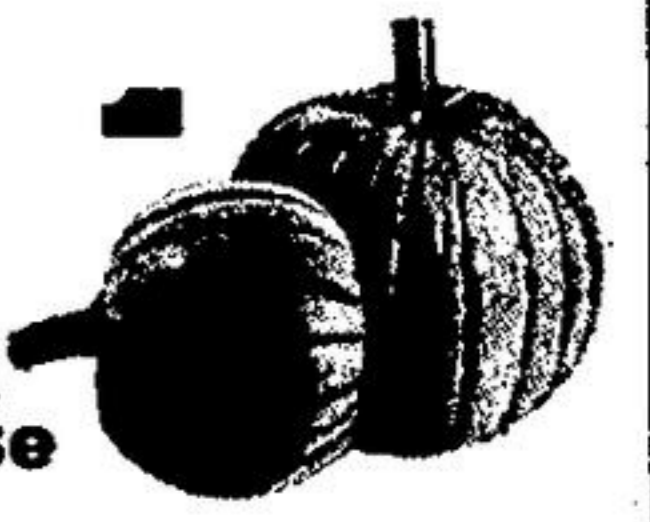
