Murder Victim Told Drive to Georgetown

Two men are being held by police for questioning today in connection with the fatal stabbing of a Brampton man and the wounding of his brother Sunday night.
Hubert Smith, 19, of Church Street West, Brampton, is the dead man.
This latest development followed a day-long search Monday for two men, one described as being blond, the other dark-haired.
Meanwhile, Edward Smith, 24, of Alexander Street, is reported to be in satisfactory condition in Mississauga Hospital.
OUT FOR COFFEE
Friends where Hubert was staying, said Edward picked Hubert up at 7 p.m. Sunday night and they went out for a coffee. Hubert never returned.

Police said Monday that Edward told them he and his brother had left a restaurant in Brampton when two unidentified men approached them, jumped in the car, pulled a knife and ordered to be driven to Georgetown.
Edward told police he drove along Steeles Avenue and then veered into a ditch on the south side of the road. He and his brother jumped out and ran. Edward said they caught him first, stabbed him and then chased after Hubert and stabbed him to death. Edward survived by feigning death.
A passing motorist spotted the Smith vehicle in the ditch with its headlights on and the radio blaring. He reported it to the police as an accident.

FLAGGED CAR
Before the police arrived on the scene Edward had flagged down a couple in a passing car. They noticed his wounds and drove him to Mississauga Hospital.
After talking to Edward the police went back to the scene and found Hubert lying dead a short distance from the road near the railway tracks.
Police used tracking dogs Monday morning to comb the area for clues but they said they found nothing. They said no weapons were found but the wounds indicate that the knives used were large like a butcher's knife or a hunting knife.
