## Was Artist; Teacher At Conestoga College

A talented commercial artist and former Georgetown resident, Gastone (Gus) Fantuz died in a motor accident at Kitchener on October 22. He was en route to his teaching position at Conestoga College when the accident occurred. He was 43.

Mr. and Mrs. Fantuz had recently moved to Millbank from R.R. 3, Georgetown.

Born in Italy, he came to Canada in 1939 with his parents, worked as an apprentice cook and eventually became a master cook. He attended the Banff School of Fine Arts in 1947-48 and by 1951 was working with Cocksbutt Farm Equipment as a technical illustrator. From 1955 to 1960 he was with Avro at Malton, as a technical artist and

participating in the development of designs for flying saucer craft.

For the next 10 years he worked as a freelance artist, illustrated many textbooks for publishers, while also producing wood, plastic and metal sculptures, mainly on a religious theme. The new Holy Cross Church in Georgetown boasts some of his finest work. He executed the beautiful metal sculpture which hangs at the front of the church and also designed the stations of the cross.

Since 1969, he had taught at Conestoga, chiefly in the area of freehand drawing in the technology division.

He leaves his wife, Joan Ferguson; five children, JoAnne, Jamie, Michael, Fergus,

and Deanna, his parents, Angelo and Marguerita Fantuz, and brothers Mario and Enza.

Requiem mass was conducted in Holy Cross Church here on October 25, with Father Oger Devent officiating and interment was in Greenwood Cemetery. Pallbearers were George Frost, Lyn Gritani, Ernie Rosset, Joe Bigattini, Mario Ferri and John Lapresti.

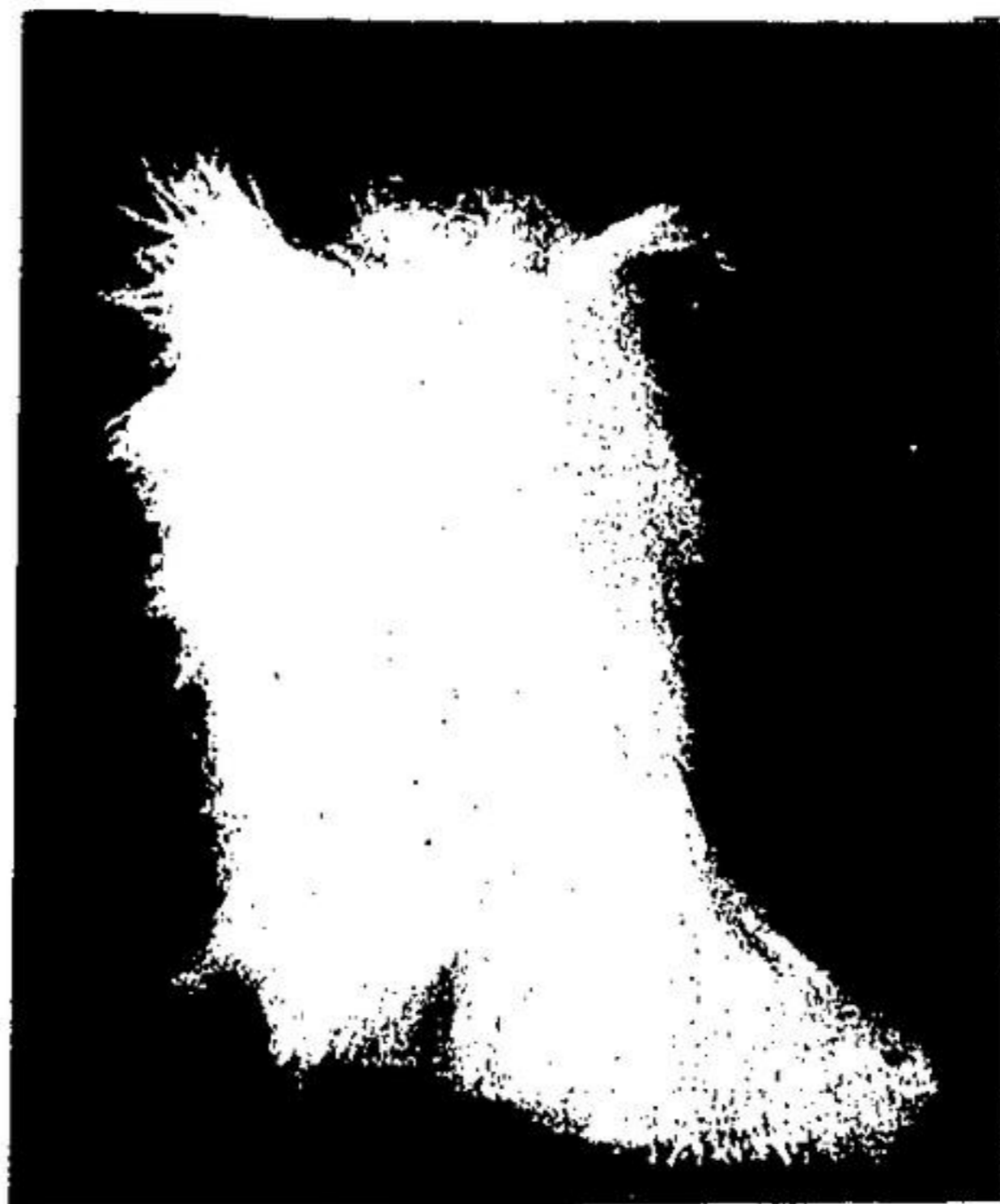
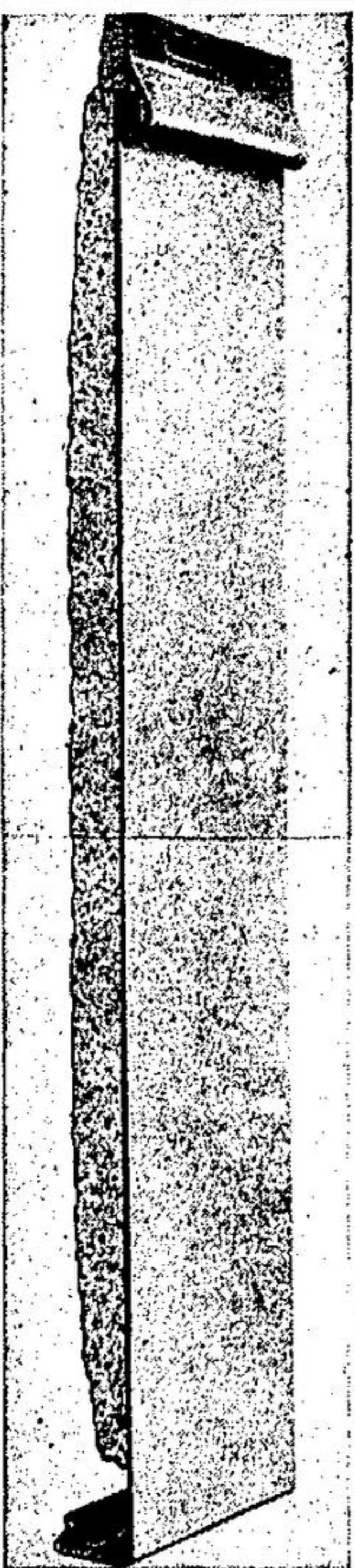
