320 More Apply For Employment

An increase of 320 applicants seeking employment with the local area office of Canada Manpower in September over August, has been attributed in major part to a large increase in applicants seeking clerical or sales positions.

Howard Fullard, manager of the area office, said clients registered for employment at the end of September was 3,637. At the end of August, the figure was 3,317.

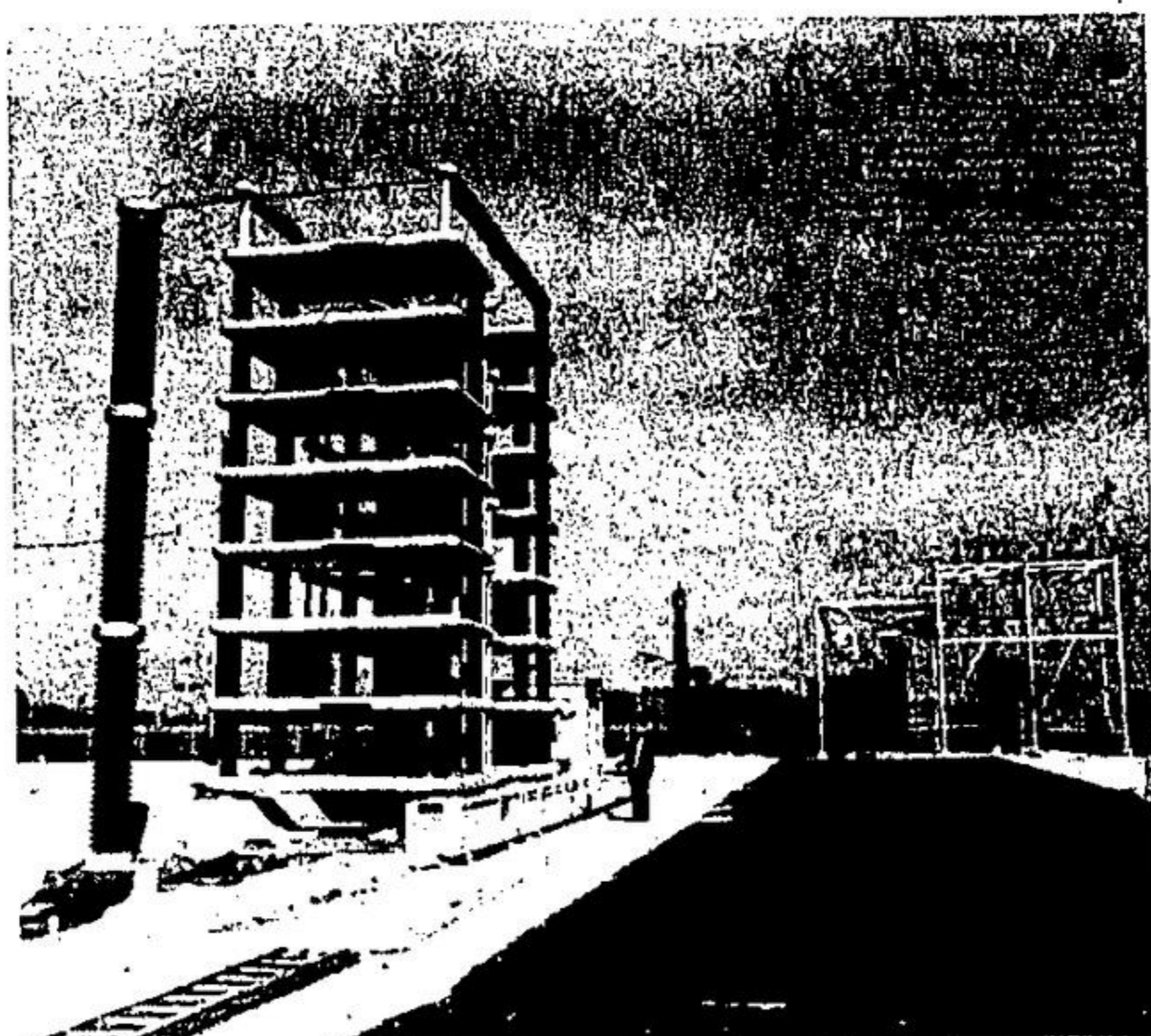

"During September we did a lot of advertising for the staffing of Eaton's at Bramalea and Zeller's in Georgetown. This stimulated inquiries and increased the number of applicants on our rolls," he said. Mr. Fullard listed as examples the number of applicants under the clerical and sales divisions. "In clerical, our applications jumped from 726 to 889 during September, and in sales, the increase was from 651 to 1,051," he said.

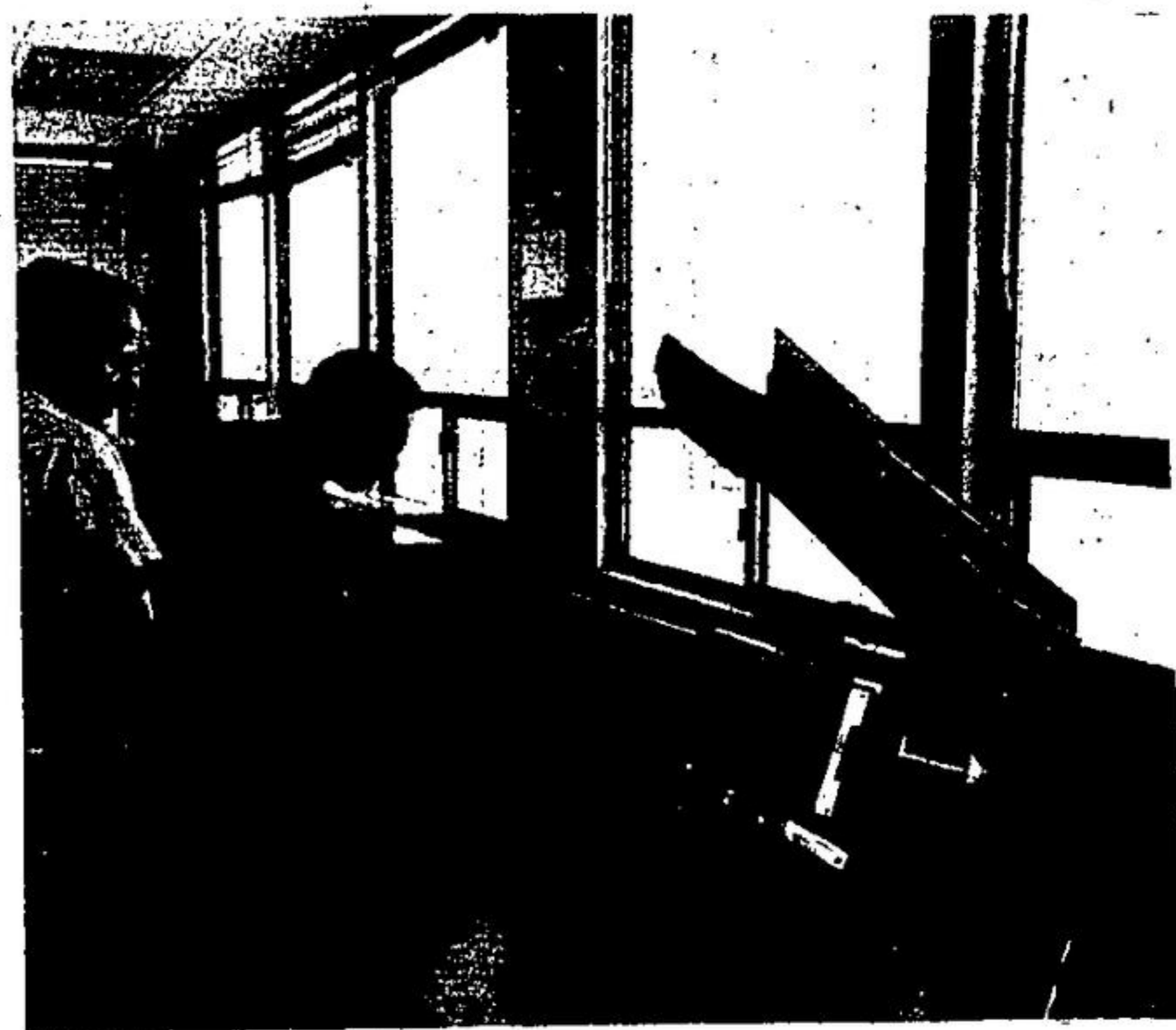

This huge surge generator capable of producing lightning strokes of the magnitude of 2,500,000 volts, can simulate the effects of lightning strikes on power lines. The unit also produces switching surges of about

1,600,000 volts. The equipment is part of an experimental outdoor field investigation set-up installed by Ontario Hydro at the Kleinburg transformer station grounds. Exhaustive studies

by hydro scientists and engineers will be carried out to learn ways of improving the transmission of electrical power at high voltages in a compact manner.



Engineering Technologist Rod Keizer (foreground) and Electrical Engineer Al J. Reed, are setting up a test on the console in the field experimental lab using the big surge generator in the grounds outside. Mr. Reed is

setting a dial to start in motion a simulated lightning stroke. The principal work of this field lab. will be studying the means of improving electrical power transmission at high voltages in a compact manner. This study

is expected to proceed for many years and likely will save Ontario Hydro millions of dollars in constructing new super highways of power across the Province.

Another veteran with the North Halton OPP detachment, Const. Carmen H. Wright recently received a promotion to the rank of Corporal and a transfer to Port Credit OPP detachment. Cpl. Wright has been with the OPP almost 16 years, starting in Waterdown and spending 14 years with the Milton-based force that covers the North Halton area.

Port Credit handles mainly traffic work on the Queen Elizabeth Highway and Highways 401 and 27 in the area west of Metro Toronto.

It is a larger force than North

Halton's, with a Staff Sergeant, six Corporals and 51 men. Cpl. Wright has a platoon of seven men working with him.

Studs on Tires Worth \$100 Fine

The Highway Traffic Act does not provide for any exception to the ban on the use of studded tires in Ontario this winter. Deputy Minister of Transportation and Communications A.T.C. McNab said in a statement issued today.

The regulation prohibiting their further use, which was passed last year, makes it an offence for any vehicle to be equipped with studs on Ontario highways, roads and streets," he said. Drivers using studs may be

subject to fines ranging from \$20 to \$100. Mr. McNab said the province took the lead in banning studs

because research carried out in Ontario on their effectiveness and effects on highway damage was more advanced than other jurisdictions.
