
"We strongly tage you to adopt Recommendation It as outlined by Mining Commissioner J. F. Me-Farlandorhis report of October 28" the letter says. "It offers the only hope for preserving the character of this community, which is visited annually by thousands of tourists.

The Committee says that the many proposed controls suggested The Committee, chaired by Terra in other recommendations in Mr. Cotta residents John Agg and McFarland's report "to some William Doole, claims that the extent would eliminate a number of irksome side effects of pit operations."

But it says renewal of a pit ticence "would entail intolerable traffic conditions and generally destroy the peace and quiet of a scenic, escarpment area."

The Committee has asked the Minister to place the property in the public domain "by purchase or expropriation, for whatever ecologically and environmentally compatible purpose the Ontario government may select."

"We are in sympathy with the oggregate industry's needs" the letter concludes "but sooner or later escarpment sources will disappear and alternative locations must be found. Why not explore these possibilities now while some of our heritage remains intact?"


