Debate Best Way To Safeguard Crossings

A petition asking for crossing guards at the intersection of Delrex and Weber Drive sparked a discussion at committee meeting Monday night, on various methods of controlling the traffic. At present there is a three way stop at the corner. The letter claimed many drivers do not stop, and some come only to a partial stop. Town engineer Eric Willis, instructed at an earlier meeting to find out costs of lights, told committee flashing beacons on top of the existing stop signs would cost \$180 each. An overhead flashing light facing two ways would cost \$300 and facing three ways, \$381. Cr. Ernie Sykes commented, "In my opinion that's one of the heaviest policed intersections in town". Cr. Donna Denison suggested all crossings on school routes, even some distance from schools should be marked with a "children crossing" sign. Reeve Ric Morrow pointed out the cost of crossing guards was over \$12,000 this year, and contended flashing lights would be cheaper in the long run. Cr. Joan Smith suggested school student safety patrols could be used. "I realize most of the school only go as far as grade 5 or 6 now, but 10 or 11 year olds are very conscientious". Council decided to ask both the Halton County Board of Education and the Halton County Separate School Board for their comments on using schoolboy crossing guards. The police will also be asked to evaluate the take at the corner.
