Mrs. Evelyn Wilson presented her program "Personality and relationships" at a meeting of Zeta Alpha Chapter, Beta Sigma Phi, at the home of Mrs. V. Owen November 16.

She introduced her program by defining personality as being the outward evidence of one's character - the habitual way of appearing and reacting in daily situations, in the home, place of employment, club, or wherever one is associated with others.

What we are in any given situation is important, she said, but what we are, instinctively, in all situations, is what matters most.

We must react and act the right way and say the right thing in every life situation in which we may find ourselves. This can result only from knowledge of what is desirable and how to acquire it, followed by long and continued daily practice to develop and retain right habits of conduct.

THREESYPES

There are three types of personality, she said - the introvert, who

has few friends and prefers being alone; the extrovert who craves lots of company and excitement; and the ambivert, who is a mixture of the two. This is the most common.

To acquaint members with their type of personality, Mrs. Wilson passed out analysis sheets to be honestly filled out. Most members were surprised to discover that where they thought they were introverts, analysis charts showed them to be the opposite, and vice versa.

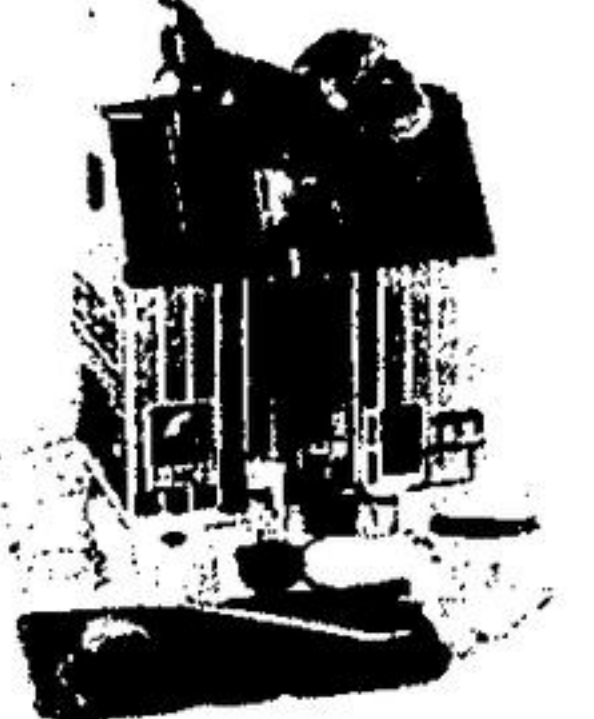

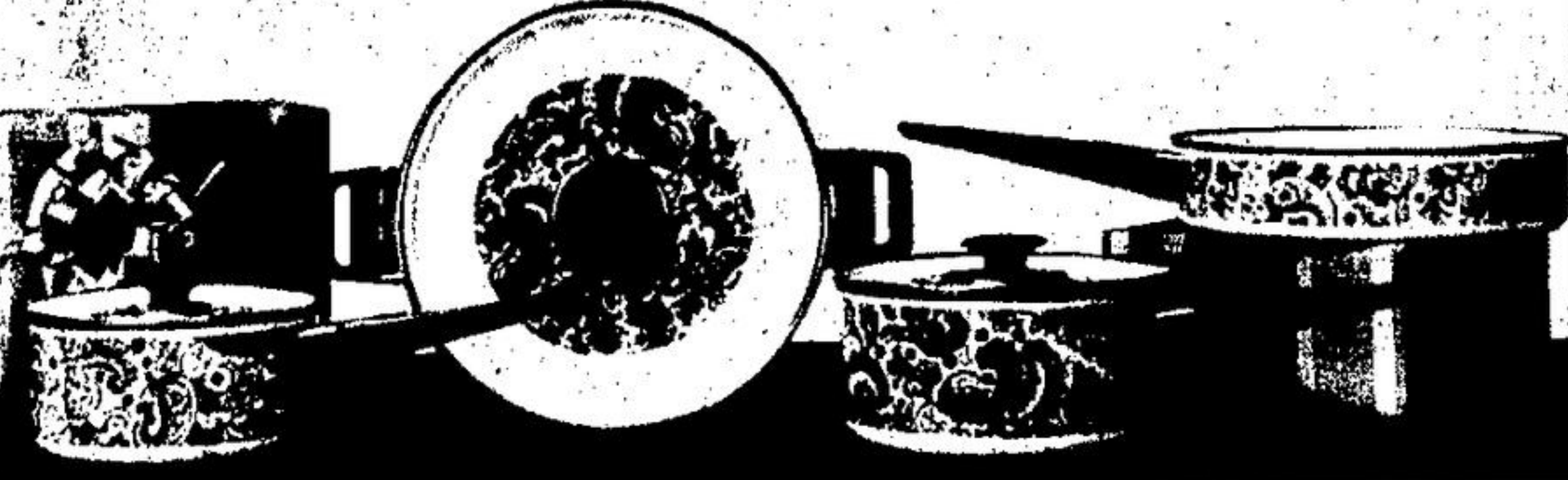

Museum Open House And Christmas Party Are 'Go'

Printing out that the October report from the Halton county Museum Board stated there would be no Open House nor Christmas party this year, Reeve Ric Morrow suggested at the Nov. 16 county council meeting that the museum board would be making a mockery of county council, if they proceeded with them anyway.

The museum report had been passed by County council Tuesday afternoon, with no mention of any plans for resurrecting either the Open House or the Christmas party. Reeve Morrow asked Warden Frank Oakes if he knew if the museum board had changed its mind the day before the county council meeting.

Warden Oakes said the Open House last year lasted 17 days which the board decided was too long. "They then decided to abandon the Open House completely, however many people seemed disappointed, so at the November meeting they reinstated an Open House, but only three days

long". Reeve Morrow said, "We won't have the November minutes showing this decision until a couple of days after the open house."

The Open House is scheduled for Dec. 17, 18, and 19, while the next county council meeting at which the decision of the board would be known to county council will be Dec. 21.

Deputy-reeve David Coons of Burlington, asked, "Well is there a party or not?" There has always been a Christmas party to which all county council and others were asked.

Throughout the year Reeve Morrow has criticized this expenditure. MEMBERS ONLY Deputy-reeve Russell Miller of Esquimaux, a member of the Museum board, replied, "There's going to be a party, but it is going to be out of the members own pockets, and it has nothing to do with county council. It is only going to be for the members".

Reeve Anna MacArthur another member of the museum board, remarked, "The members will approve the invitation list". Turning to Reeve Morrow she commented, "Don't worry Uncle Art will look after you". Deputy-reeve Art Speight is a member of the museum board.

Lights Went Out When Car Slammed Hydro Pole

The lights went out around Stewarttown, Tuesday night November 16, at midnight, as a result of a car hitting a hydro pole.

Douglas Hutt, 32 Irwin Crescent, Georgetown, was taken to Georgetown Hospital suffering cuts and bruises after his '70 Chev hit the pole, causing \$1,200 damage to the car.

\$650 was the total damage in an accident on the 4th line, north of No. 7 Highway, when a '71 Dodge driven by Thomas Turner of Eden Mills collided with a '61 Volkswagen driven by Dale Goulin of R.R.1 Campbellville. \$300 damage was done to the Dodge and \$350 to the Volkswagen.

Deer must like the corner of 25 Highway and 15 sideroad. Two accidents on this spot were caused by deer running across the road, one on November 15 and one on November 13.

In the November 13 accident, Michael Marchmont of Acton driving a '71 Ford collided with the deer, damaging his car to the extent of \$70, but killing the deer.

In the November 15 accident, the deer was luckier, he scampered off unhurt, but \$500 damage was done to '70 Ford driven by Gerhart Wagner of Oakville.

The 9th line north of 27 sideroad was the scene of a single car accident November 14, when Gregory Ball, 34 John St. West, lost control of his car, causing \$500 damage.
