Fight Bell Rise Council Decides

Georgetown council voted Monday to oppose a rate increase for telephone service requested by Bell Canada.

Mayor Wm. H. Smith hit out at the company for asking for an interim increase until a decision is made by the Board of Transport on the rate request.

"One of the most disgusting things I've ever heard" he said.

Council voted to support the Ontario Municipal Association and the Association of Mayors and Reeves in fighting the increase. A letter from those bodies said the increase would produce 78.1 million dollars in extra revenue for Bell.

THE CONTRARY
Georgetown has a share in a fund established a few years ago, which will be used to battle the firm. It is possible that Georgetown will be assessed a further share, the mayor said.

Cr. Phil Siddall had some complimentary remarks to make about the Bell firm too.
