Councillor Smith cautioned that an influx of new families into an area requires increased facilities. and quoted the statistics of facilities required for 100 families as regards firemen, policemen, schools, water, sewers, hospital beds and even books in the library.

On the human side, she pointed out that this would be an isolated area for families to reside in and stated that studies have shown isolation can have a poor effect on human nature. She cited the predicament of a young mother who runs out of bread or milk and her husband is away with the car how would she get it.

Also, she felt it a dangerous location for children due to existing industry and the necessity to walk along the highway in order to reach any other location.
