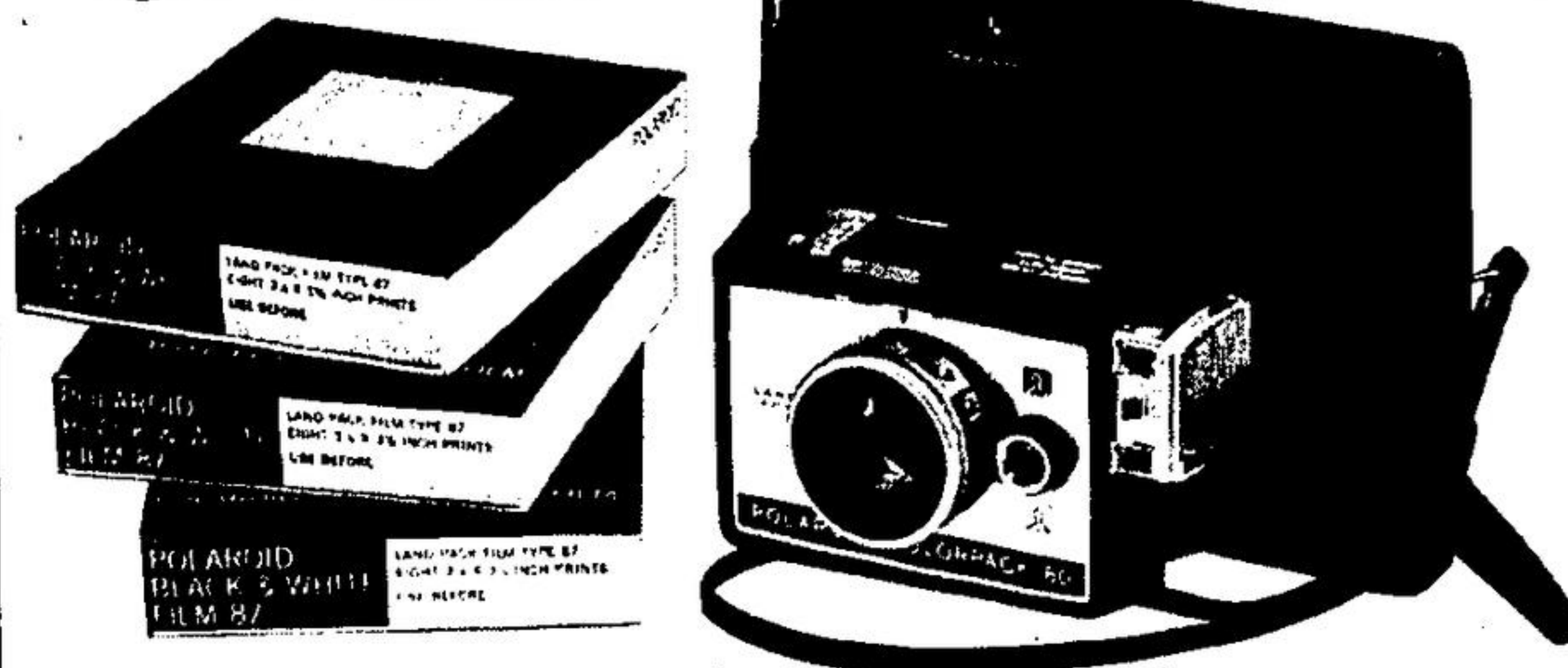

Land Sale May Lead to Opening Harold Street

Council sold 1.67 acres of town land, plus possibly five lots, to Howard Caton, for \$25,000, last Monday night.

Caton will add this land to his own property, known as the Hutt property, which fronts on Charles Street and runs back to join the town-owned, wedge-shaped piece of land, which extends to the back of Park school and the fairgrounds.

The sale is conditional on Caton being awarded the tender for a 38 unit senior citizens housing unit by the Ontario Housing Corporation. Caton must fully service the area and open up and complete Harold Street, (an unopened road allowance).

SUBDIVISION
Development of any of the remainder of the land will require the usual Planning Board, O.W.R.C. and council approvals. A plan of subdivision

must be submitted for the 18 lot, single family homes. Caton intends to build.

If Caton is not awarded the tender for the Senior Citizens units, the land sale is off, and the land reverts to the town.

Thursday night at committee meeting, Caton asked if there were any lot levies on such units. He told council Mississauga charged half the normal rate for multiple dwellings.

LOT LEVY
"There's no reason we should make a gift to the O.H.C. if it's not done elsewhere", commented Cr. Ern Hyde.

The Committee agreed upon a lot levy of \$225 per unit should be imposed on the senior citizens units.

Cr. Harry Levy explained that the costs would not affect the rent charged the residents. "The rent is based on income", he added.
