Special Education

May Transfer Some Pupils Back to Regular Classes

Students currently enrolled in the Halton special education classes may be transferred back to regular classes, at least on a part-time basis.

The Halton board of education's sub-committee on existing programs has been studying three topics—adult and extension education, extra-curricular activities and special education, and made the recommendation concerning students in special classes.

The sub-committee report said "all teachers, particularly kindergarten and primary, could benefit from additional training and information regarding children with special problems."

The sub-committee recommended that teachers take additional university courses and learn of physical education techniques which are pertinent to the training of children with learning problems.

**INTEGRATE**

The report suggested the board "implement a pilot project to fully integrate Special Education pupils into the regular program."

Miss Edna Robinson, assistant superintendent with the board, said the students in the pilot project "would probably be brought out of the regular class for the math and language programs."

Trustee Judy Alexander asked: "Isn't it the stigma and dislocation we're trying to correct?" She felt that shuffling the students from one class to another after their previous dislocation to another school would only complicate the problems of the students.

**DETRIMENTAL**

The special education students would be integrated in regular classes at the school where they take special education, Aldershot high school principal Jim Baker said. "We're talking about taking the best kids out and integrating them," he said. "The lower ability students would still be in the special education class."

Gary Bateman a teacher at Acton high school, said no consideration is being given to emotionally-disturbed children.

"Emotionally-disturbed and perceptually-handicapped students are now being grouped together," Bateman said. "It's detrimental to both groups. There are no facilities for children with emotional problems."

**SPREAD THIN**

"Three psychologists among 90 schools is spread pretty thin," Eric Balkind of Georgetown, a committee member said.

"Where's the money going to come from?" E. S. Lavender asked.

"It depends on where it is on the priority list," Mrs. Alexander said.

The subcommittee recommended increased facilities for special education students, and said "better cooperation is needed between the schools and local agencies. This would save valuable time for the psychologists who are receiving referrals that might be readily handled at school level."

**Had Dental Office In Georgetown, Erin**

A dentist in Georgetown and Erin until he retired, Dr. Clifford George Reid, 78, died suddenly while vacationing at Lake Worth, Florida, December 6.

A native of Niagara-on-the-Lake, he was the son of George and Jessie Ball Reid. He attended public and high school there, then graduated from the Ontario Dental College in Toronto. He served for three years during World War I, overseas with the Canadian Dental Corps.

Dr. Reid established a dental practice here in 1941, taking over the office of the late Dr. Gollop, above what is now Young's Pharmacy. When he purchased a farm home near Ballinacree, he moved his office to Erin, and later had his office in his home there.

He was a member of Credit Masonic Lodge, Georgetown and Masonic Lodge No. 2 at Niagara-on-the-Lake. An Anglican, with his wife he was leader of the Boys' League at St. George's

Church, which operated successfully some years ago.

He leaves his wife, Vera Elizabeth Black, and a brother Walter M. Reid of Niagara-on-the-Lake. A brother, Albert, predeceased him.

Rev. Kelvin Johnston of Ballinacree United Church and Canon James Maxwell of St. John's Anglican, Stewarttown, conducted the funeral service last Thursday at the McClure-Jones Funeral Home, with interment following in Greenwood Cemetery. Pallbearers were Willard Sanderson, Leo Jamieson, Allan Jamieson, Douglas Woods, George Glassford, Edward Molody, John T. Armstrong and Garnet Sinclair.
