Beware of the Christmas crook who shows up at your home or business with a fantastic bargain. The profit will be all his... not yours.

Be cautious in accepting packages for your neighbor. The variations on package delivery fraud are endless and include many "unorderd merchandise" gimmicks. When a legitimate looking delivery man asks if you will accept a package for your neighbor that has a small delivery fee to be paid, you may become the victim of one of the most lucrative of all swindles. The package could be filled with wadded newspapers, and your neighbor will not have ordered anything from the company.

Unfortunately, not all charity solicitations at Christmas time are legitimate. Give generously to your local well known and established charities if you wish — but don't be too quick to give your cash or check to mail solicitors you have never seen. Some con men solicit contributions by telephone — unless you know the person and the organization or have any doubts about a charity — contact the Better Business Bureau.

The legitimate Christmas charity deserves to be supported and the itinerant collector deserves to be stopped.

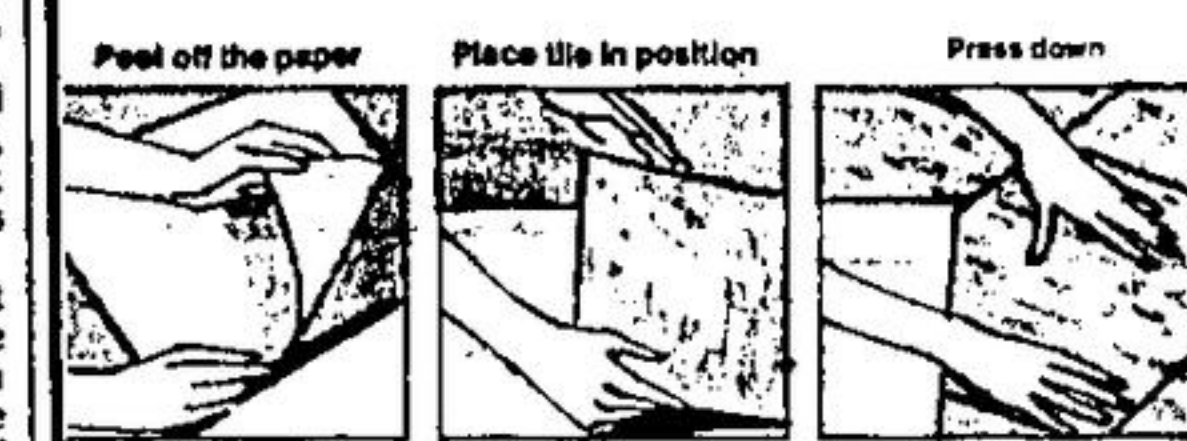

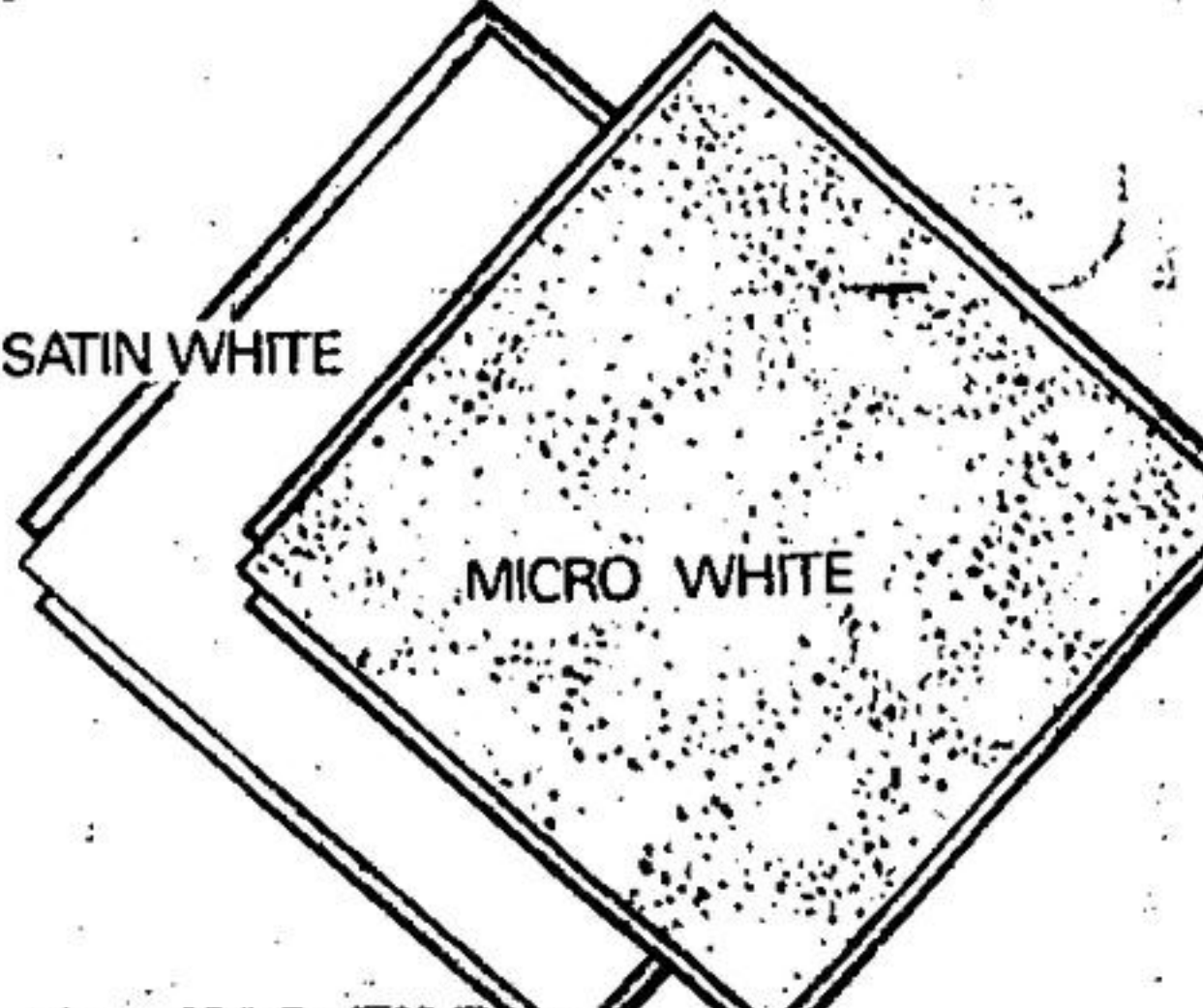
