## THE DISTRICT AT A GLANCE

**Approve Day Care Centre**  
 ACTON—By a vote of 6-3 Acton council has approved in principle operation on a municipally owned day care centre. The Department of Social and Family Services must still investigate Acton's need of a day care centre before it becomes a reality, but council's approval in principle of this project was needed before December 31 in order to have the application for provincial assistance considered.

**Snowmobiling on Decline?**  
 BRAMPTON—A story in the Brampton Daily Times says that although the snowmobile industry continues to grow by leaps and bounds over the past two years there are indications that the sport had reached its peak. Several Brampton and district dealers questioned were sceptical that sales would match the record set two years ago although they were optimistic about last year's total. One dealer said that sales had been a little disappointing this year due mainly to the absence of what he called "white gold".

**200 Truckers Visit 'Mom'**  
 CAMPBELLVILLE—More than 200 of Mrs. Joyce Spencer's children dropped in for Christmas dinner over the holidays. Mrs. Spencer's children all drive trucks and each day more than 200 of them tumbled off Highway 401 to eat at her restaurant on Campbellville road. They call her mother and she and her husband know them all by their first names. A 24 hour free Christmas dinner was Mrs. Spencer's Christmas gift to the truckers last Wednesday.

**Want Recreation Director in '72**  
 MILTON—Approval to seek a full time recreation director will be sought by Milton Parks and Recreation Committee early in the new year the board agreed at its final meeting of the year. Members pointed to an increasing number of programs and continuing difficulty in board members organizing and carrying out the preparation and programs as reason for seeking full time staff.

**Stuck With Garbage**  
 NASSAGAWEYA—It appears the Stop Pollution in Nassagaweya (SPIN) group will have to dispose of its own garbage. The ecology group gathers up re-usable garbage throughout Nassagaweya and was hoping to obtain the services of township trucks to dispose of the waste. But Nassagaweya council has learned it is not economically feasible to dispose of the refuse. The clerk estimated the cost of collecting and trucking the waste to garbage collecting agencies in Hamilton and Guelph was probably twice the amount the township would receive from the agencies.

**Beaver Dams A Nuisance**  
 CALEDON—The population of beavers is growing in North Caledon Township according to deputy reeve Ed Black. Beaver dams have caused flooding over a five-acre area near his home on Highway 10 and more flooding has been reported in the east and west areas of the township, he said.

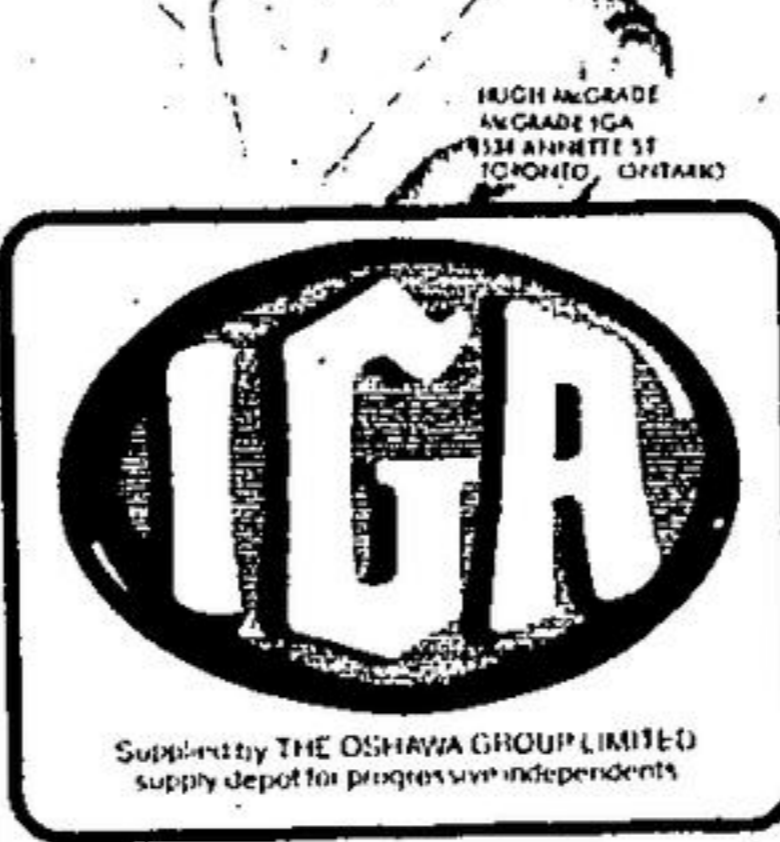
**PROMOTIONS**

**GLIDER PROGRAM**  
 Soaring and gliding is an in-thing and the consensus is that gliding will leave the air in the Air Cadet organization, (quote ATC bulletin)  
 Air Transport Command and the Ontario Provincial Committee have embarked on a three year expansion program in Ontario. We all know of the glider activities at summer camp when Mountain View was operational from breakfast to dusk. For the total camp period of six weeks. The Trenton Gliding Centre is now operating from 2nd September, 1971 to 3 June, 1972, for conducting Air Cadet familiarization flying and pilot training.

The first year of the expansion program, starting September, 1971, will see the formation of North Bay Gliding Centre and also establish a basis of operation at Camp Borden. At 1971 summer camp, some adults and cadets were selected from these areas to undergo the necessary training so as to permit initially North Bay to operate on their own in September. One glider and winch was moved from Trenton to South River Airport at the end of the summer camp. Further information on gliding will appear in next week's column.
