LET'S PLAY BRIDGE

Careful use of entries is important in many hands that you may play as declarer. Here is a hand where declarer must be careful to use every entry available.

East dealt with North-South vulnerable

NORTH S-64 H-K765 D-AQ953 C-85

EAST S-J10873 H-Void D-J1062 C-1063

SOUTH S-Q2 H-AJ1089432 D-Void C-AQ4

The bidding

EAST Pass 2S Pass Pass

SOUTH 1H 3H 3H 5H

WEST 4C 4S All pass

Opening lead - king of spades

Some of you may object to South's opening of a mere one bid. Even if the hand were stronger, I would still open only one heart. With highly distributional hands and unfavorable vulnerability, I recommend an opening bid of just one. Anything more is likely to drive the opponents to sacrifice. South must appear to be reluctant to bid game but even at that West went on to four spades. South had to go five hearts with his long heart suit just in case East - West can make four spades (which they can).

LED KING

West led the spade king and continued with the ace. Declarer must now make the balance of the tricks. One club can be discarded on the diamond ace but where can the other one go. The

\$2,603 Per Pupil Concerned With High Price Tag On Trainable Retarded Program

A recommendation that the current program for trainable retarded children in Halton schools be reviewed has been turned over to the board of education's executive committee for further study.

Noel Cooper, trustee for Burlington Ward 4, and Tom Watson, trustee for Acton and Nassagaweya, made the recommendation after they attended a conference of the Canadian Association for the Mentally Retarded in Halifax.

While in Halifax, the two school trustees studied the city's facilities for education of trainable retarded children.

GOOD VALUE

Cooper and Watson recommended "that a complete assessment of our staff, program and facilities be carried out by an outside person or agency in order that this board can be assured that good value is received for money spent." The recommendation was made "in view of this board's high cost (\$2,603 per pupil) in educating its retarded."

Watson said "The cost does seem to be spiralling" for trainable retarded education.

SIMPLE

Director of education, Jim Singleton, said the facilities for educating trainable retarded children "are so hedged by government regulations that I despair that an outside individual could be of any assistance. The regulation is very simple... no more than eight children per teacher."

Watson said "the lack of information that some parents have is quite evident," which compounds the problem of educating trainable retarded children.

TRANSPORTATION

W. A. Lawson, trustee for Esqueping, said "there's a dislocation problem with this kind of child - perhaps more than other children," referring to the transportation of special education students to often distant schools.

Singleton said "the idea they're being shifted on a whim doesn't have a basis." Then the director added that the Halton board has "wrestled with this problem of transportation before."

Watson said "some of the top men in the field told us three per cent of the population is retarded in some way. These are 1970 figures. By 1980 they say 10 per cent of Canada's population will be mentally retarded in some way. This scares the hell out of you."

TO BE STUDIED

Watson and Cooper recommended that "a parent indoctrination course be a prerequisite to the entering of a child in one of our schools for the trainable retarded."

The trustees also "recommended that a pilot project to integrate two classrooms of younger retarded into a regular elementary school be undertaken."

The recommendations will be studied by the board's executive committee before being presented to the board again.
