

# Town Hockey Bantams Are Minor Olympics Champions

Georgetown Major Bantams of the Tri-County Hockey League are the first team to have their name on the Bantam championship trophy at the first annual Golden Gardens Minor Olympics at Simcoe.

The holiday hockey tournament ran from December 27 to Thursday night December 30.

Georgetown Major Bantams went undefeated in five games defeating Lambeth 9-1 in their final test Thursday night.

Earlier the same day they downed Chicago 4-2, Monday they blanked Simcoe 7-0, and Tuesday beat Port Dover by the same score before edging

Waterford 1-0.

**SCORING CROWN**  
In their five games the Bantam champs scored 23 goals and allowed just three.

A member of the Georgetown Major Bantams, Dean Popiel copped the scoring honours by amassing 15 points.

The champions' netminding was shared by Gerald Williams and Al Demasore.

Each member of the team received gold individual trophies.

**RUNNERS UP**  
Two other Georgetown teams at the Minor Olympics earned

runner-up honours in their divisions and received team trophies plus individual silver trophies.

Georgetown Major PeeWees finished in a three way tie with Lambeth and Brantford, but were placed second behind Lambeth when "goals for" became the deciding factor.

Their record included victories over Simcoe (5-2), Delhi (3-2), Galt (2-1), and 2-1 loss to Brantford, and a 1-1 tie with Lambeth in the final game.

Georgetown scored just one less goal than Lambeth in the tournament, and one more than third place Brantford.

**JUST MISSED**  
Georgetown Major Novices also suffered just one setback, that in the final game to Waterford who captured the title.

The local Novices entered the last game leading Waterford by a point after four straight victories, but dropped the crucial game 2-1.

They chalked up their victories against Simcoe (3-0), Port Dover (3-1), Delhi (4-1), and Tillsonburg (7-1).

Georgetown's only other entry in the tournament the Minor Midgets finished fourth in their age bracket despite a good effort against highly rated competition.

**GLIDER PROGRAM**

A glider and winch are now positioned at Camp Borden and the glider should have been operational since the end of October. However, I understand the glider was damaged in transit and was returned to Trenton for repairs.

Squadrons assigned to Chatham have been gliding for some time using gliders of the Chatham Gliding Club but the financial advantage for Chatham to operate OPC equipment is now under consideration.

The second cadet year 1972-73 will see emphasis on developing Camp Borden and also creating additional instructor pilots in order to step-up the rate of instruction to cadets. North Bay centre may be progressive enough to begin a northern sub-centre.

Timmins is in mind for such expansion, also in the third year expansion toward Sault Ste Marie.

Cadet scholarships and adult exchange program in Canada or to U.K. and U.S.A. should be at an advanced planning stage.

We of 756, Squadron have been assigned to Camp Borden for gliding and pilot training. The Surgeon General's office is reviewing the Glider Pilot Medical requirements. At this time it appears that Air Cadets and adults will have to be certified medically fit to an M.O.T. Private Pilot standard prior to joining a glider pilot course. There is no medical examination required for a cadet undergoing familiarization flying.

# Rabies: The Danger Has Become Real

In recent years rabies has spread from Northern to Southern Ontario concentrated mainly in the skunk and fox populations. Over the years there have been a number of localized "scare" in which domestic animals were suspected of being rabid. These scares have always resulted in a reaction on the part of a very naturally concerned general public. Any animal behaving strangely has been thought to be "rabid" when, in fact, it was nothing of the kind. But, to be on the safe side, Medical Officers of Health have always, as a general policy, required animals that have bitten anybody, even if the bite was little more than a scratch, to be held in quarantine.

Rabies is a disease communicable to man and is the concern of the Federal Government. Department of Agriculture, Health of Animals Branch and, of course, the Medical Health Officers of the country. Few diseases are more frightening.

Some years ago the Ontario Humane Society reached the conclusion that the real danger to the general public lay in the possibility of rabies becoming common-place in the pet animal population, particularly dogs and cats.

**OBVIOUS**  
Most people can recognize when a wild animal is behaving abnormally. When a muskrat attacks a large dog there is something very obviously wrong. When a timid, secretive fox becomes bold, brash and quite fearless then, obviously something is equally wrong. The average person is instinctively cautious of wild animals. It is probably this instinct which has

prevented the public being seriously exposed to the danger of rabies despite the fact that the disease has been endemic in the fox and skunk population for many years.

The same reaction certainly does not apply to the dogs and cats which are kept as pets in large numbers in the Province.

The Society, therefore, felt, and still feels, that the Government should require owners of pets to have their animals inoculated against rabies and that this inoculation should be mandatory. It should be a condition of harbouring a pet. It is necessary for the well-being of the general public and the health and well-being of the animals themselves.

**INNOCENT**  
The typical frightened reaction to a rabies scare is all too common to Humane Society workers. One case of rabies in a human being will produce a wave of pet killing, a reaction which is generally unreasonable and uncontrolled. When this occurs thousands of perfectly innocent, healthy pet animals are killed.

For their sake, and for the sake of the health of the general public, compulsory rabies inoculation is the only sensible solution.

Naturally there will be difficulties in administering such a requirement but these difficulties could be overcome given the cooperation of the Federal Health of Animals Branch, practicing veterinarians, Government of Ontario, Department of Agriculture (Veterinary Services Branch) and the Ontario Humane Society, its 48 Branches and Affiliated Societies and municipal pounds.

**QUARANTINES**  
During 1971 the Society has become painfully aware that the danger, of which we were so frightened, has now become a reality. This year, for the first time, a number of dogs and cats quarantined in our shelters have been found to be rabid. Many of the Society's employees responsible for caring for these animals have been either bitten by a rabid animal or exposed to the danger. These men and

women, who accept this danger as part of their daily life have, of course, been required to take the protective series of shots. The inoculations are extremely painful. Some people find themselves unable to complete the course.

Over 300 dogs and cats have been quarantined as rabies suspects during the first ten months of 1971. The danger is obvious and cannot be over-emphasized.
