'People Helping Change Happen' That's Canadian Y Week Theme

Holbrook R. Davis, president, YMCA of Canada, and Mrs. P. J. Chadsey, president YWCA of Canada, have announced that the week of January 17-23 will be Canadian Y week, with the theme "People Helping Change Happen".

In doing so they said "both organizations pre-date Confederation and today millions of Canadians support or participate in Y activities."

"Both organizations were basically evangelical when started over a century ago. As they evolved and matured, their range of concerns was expanded to include the social, recreational and physical needs of people."

"Emotional idealism, genuine concern and a sincere desire to help won't by themselves solve problems of such magnitude and complexity. The Ys of Canada have the resources and skill to prepare guidelines and create opportunities for people to participate in the search for answers."

Accordingly, the theme of the 1972 Canadian Y Week... "People... Helping Change Happen" appears to be particularly appropriate

OVERSHADOW

"Today, while bridging different faiths, the YMs and YWs of Canada have also emerged as dynamic social forces in the communities they serve outside of their buildings.

"The continuing success of programs in gyms, pools, camps and club rooms often tends to overshadow our increasing involvement with modern day problems arising from urbanism, technological change and social tension.
