### These Tips Can Help You Ice Fishermen

Unlike Christmas, a full moon and glistening snow, was a special treat for everyone, as the old year went out and the New Year came in.

Skiers and snowmobilers had a good weekend to say the least. Most lakes and rivers are not safe as yet to travel on.

**BAITING**  
Persons who intend to place their own huts on lakes for the purpose of catching white fish and lake trout, might improve their luck by first cutting several small holes in a circle around

their fish hut. An ample supply of boiled barley and salted minnows should be dumped down each hole.

These holes should freeze over during the night. More barley and minnows should be dumped down the larger holes that the fish hut is going to be placed on. By the following weekend a fair number of fish should be around the baited area.

A three way spreader baited with live minnows is very effective. A fairly large hook three feet up from the spreader baited

with a larger minnow is a good bet for lake trout, although many good lakers are caught on the spreaders.

**DECAY**  
If one prefers to fish selectively for lake trout, a wooden decoy is a good bet. That is one which when jiggled, darts around in a circle
