

\$25,540 In Prizes

Issued 24 Raffle Licenses Last Year

"Everytime I turn around I'm buying a raffle ticket for something", is a comment heard frequently. Despite this remark, there were only 24 licenses for raffles sold in town last year.

Local organizations sold raffle tickets with prize money amounting to \$25,540 with the highest individual amount being \$7,000 in a Legion raffle.

This does not include bingos, which were issued for a series running for as many as 43 weeks, with the highest single amount \$495.

The big money raffles, such as \$100,000 or \$50,000 are not licensed locally, since they originate elsewhere. The town merely gives them authorization to sell in town. Included in this group would be such raffles as The Art Gallery, The Sportsmen's Raffle, and the giant Kinsmen raffle.

The license fee charged by the town is 2 percent of the total prize money on raffles. Bingos vary according to the value of the prizes.

All such money raising ventures come under the authority of the Department of Financial and Commercial Affairs.

Organizations holding raffles last year, were, Georgetown Senior Citizens, Federation Des Femmes Canadien Francaise, Orion Lodge Independent Order of Oddfellows, Knights of Columbus, Holy Cross Catholic Women's League, Lions Club, Royal Canadian Legion, Rotary Club, Anglers and Hunters, Minor Hockey Association, Sacred Heart Church, Kinsmen, Jaycees, and Girls' Pipe Band.

Bingos were held by Sacred Heart Church, and Holy Cross Ushers and Readers Club.

Many groups do not know they should have a license to sell raffle tickets, said town treasurer Lloyd Peterson, who issues them.
