Bail Reform Act Means Little Change Here

The introduction of the Bail Reform Act has made no difference here, according to Police Chief Harley Lowe. He said the system of releasing people on their own word, as set out in the new legislation, has been in operation here for at least the last two years.

"If they live in town, we check them out, and in 99 percent of the cases, they are sent home and told they will be summoned for a court appearance later", the Chief explained.

He pointed out this applies to such charges as impaired driving, careless driving, drinking underage, petty theft, and other charges most common in this area.

FEW HELD IN JAIL
Chief Lowe said there are very few people taken to the County Jail in Milton - or held in the local jail overnight. "Almost all are released on their own recognizance to appear at the time of trial", he commented.

The exception would be an accused with a long criminal record.
