for an average price of \$401.00. This compares to 233 head for an average of \$338.00 the previous year. A total of 32 members enrolled with 4-H Holstein calves last year - six of whom were first year members.

Abner B. Martin, president of the Holstein-Friesian Association of Canada, was present along with national directors, Earl Osborne, Bruce Reid and Howard Laidlaw. Two other Holstein breeders, Claude Pickett, Halton and Clarence Ely of Waterloo are running in this zone as national directors. The election took place at the annual meeting in Toronto on Wednesday, February 16 at the Royal York Hotel.

MILK TESTING
One of the many issues to be discussed at the annual meeting will be the suggestion that the Holstein-Friesian Association identify grade Holsteins for the purpose of milk testing and proving bulls. The Halton breeders turned down this suggestion stating that this should be left in the hands of the

provincial and federal governments.

Following a lunch served by the wives of the directors, trophies were presented to the winners at the Halton Black and White Show at Milton Fair. A special certificate of recognition was presented to Ross Segsworth, an Honorary Director of the Halton Holstein Club. Ross has been active in the Halton club since 1937, serving as a Director until 1951, a National Director until 1964 when he was National President, and Honorary Director since that time.

A \$113,316 government contract for electronic supplies has been awarded to Varian Associates of Canada Ltd. at 45 River Drive in Georgetown, by the Defense Supply Agency's Defense Electronics Supply Center in Dayton, Ohio.

The contract calls for 456 klystron electron tubes. Contracts awarded Canadian companies are let thru the Canadian Commercial Corporation at Ottawa. This is a fixed-price supply type contract awarded after competitive negotiations.

The Defense Electronics Supply Center procures, manages and supplies common electronic parts used by the armed services and various other government agencies.
