

# Humane Trapping Advocate Naturalist's Club Speaker

Neil Jotham, vice-president of the Canadian Association for Humane Trapping, demonstrated the use of traps in taking fur animals and related their history when he spoke to Georgetown District Naturalists in Park public school January 12.

The first traps to take fur animals were used in France and from there their use spread to England where they were used by poachers. As a result of being caught in one of these animals would sometimes lose a leg.

American Indians used snares and deadfalls, a method where a log or rock would fall on the animal when the trap was

triggered. When the white man came they brought the leg-hold trap and the Indian could not compete with their efficiency and therefore their use became widespread.

**MASS PRODUCED**  
The first mass production of fur animal traps was at Oneida in New York, but concern over their use did not come until 1929. That's when the Association for the protection of fur bearing animals came into being.

In 1953 a group broke away from the original organization and founded the Canadian Association for Humane Trapping.

**INSTANT KILL**  
In 1958, Frank Conibear, a well-known trapper, invented the instant killing trap bearing his name. This trap won the approval of the CAHT and in fact gave them to trappers on an exchange basis, one Conibear free for one leg-hold trap. In exchanges the CAHT has given away \$20,000 worth of traps to Canadian trappers. Public support will enable the Association to get legislation and possible grants to further their aims of preventing cruelty to animals.

The Georgetown Midget Hockey Tournament was inaugurated in 1967 by a committee of the Georgetown Minor Hockey Support group under Earl Neil and has been perpetuated since. Ajax won the first title, Georgetown took it in '68 and '69, Burlington in '70 and Barrie last year. Georgetown Midgets also have a consolation title, won in 1967, to their credit.

The 1972 tourney operates on the evenings of January 25, 27, 28 and all day Saturday the 29th.

This year's title will be sought by Georgetown, Ajax, Milton, Burlington, Brampton, Chinguacousy, Toronto Huskies, Royal York, Base Borden, Orillia, Richmond Hill, Oshawa, Detroit, Dundas, Waterloo and Downsview.
