"Doing a Lousy Job" Teacher's Death Brings Criticism on Halton

Coroner Dr. Grahame Owen said last week an inquest into the death Friday January 7 of a 22-year-old Milton school teacher is unlikely.

Dr. Owen said an inquest would accomplish little under the circumstances.

He was commenting on findings of a police investigation into the death of Mary L. Peters of Toronto, whose car went out of control on Trafalgar Rd. south of Hornby, enroute from her

Toronto home to Holy Rosary separate school in Milton.

The woman's car hit a snowy patch of road just north of Burnhamthorpe Rd., skidded broadside into the path of a south-bound car, and was hit three times by a jackknifing transport truck trying to get around the wreckage of the first two cars.

North Oakville councillor Donald Gordon had charged Monday night that "an inept and

inefficient" county roads department must take some responsibility for a poor road conditions the morning of the three-vehicle collision.

Eight hours after the accident, the road surface had yet to be sanded, Gordon said.

"I am getting fed up with the continual laxity on the part of the county," Gordon said.

"Trafalgar Rd. is one of the busiest in the town, yet it has the lowest priority as far as the county road department is concerned."

He said his efforts to urge the county engineer to have the road better ploughed and sanded seem to have been ignored.

Reeve Allan Mason said the roads become icy in a matter of minutes when the temperature

drops, and that the sanders cannot be expected to keep them clear at all times.

"I still think they're doing a lousy job," Gordon insisted.

"They did not sand that road for at least 24 hours after the accident. When I was on my way home from work at 4.30 in the afternoon, the roads were still icy and there were four cars in the ditch near where the accident occurred."

Deputy Reeve Harry Barrett also noted several citizens' complaints that there is no snow fencing along open stretches of Trafalgar to stop snow from blowing across the highway and creating dangerous driving conditions.
