

Hinton Enters Race For P.C. Nomination

H. H. "Bert" Hinton of Acton announced last week that he intends to seek the federal Progressive-Conservative nomination for Halton riding.

Others who have indicated their willingness to contest the election are James Muir and Terence O'Connor of Oakville, and possibly Dr. Ivan Hunter of Milton.

Rumour has it that a Georgetown candidate will also join the race.

Mr. Hinton announced he is standing for the nomination with the support of Acton and Esqueping Township PC associations.

The county association is hoping for a lively nomination meeting with several declared candidates and the possibility of more nominations from the floor.

IN TO WIN
"I'm going in to win it," Mr. Hinton said. "But if I don't receive the nomination I hope I helped raise some enthusiasm and the winner will get the support of the association members."

A former warden of Halton county, Bert Hinton has been on Acton council, and is currently a member of the board of directors of Sheridan College.
The PC annual meeting will be January 27 with the nomination convention March 15.

Bob MacArthur Starts 46th Year In Printing

A former Georgetown Herald employee, now with the Acton Free Press, started his 46th year in the printing industry and 57th with Dills Printing and Publishing Co. Ltd. January 10. Bob MacArthur was a Herald linotype operator for two years and wrote the North Halton Curling Club column while he lived in Georgetown.

When he started as an apprentice or "printers devil" in 1926 the Acton Free Press newspaper and plant were owned jointly by the late H. P. Moore and G. Arlof Dills.

He has chalked up a record of municipal service which was honoured Wednesday night by the presentation of a 15 year long service certificate from Ontario Hydro marking his years on the Acton Hydro Commission. He is still a member of the AHC.

While in Little Current, Bob served for five years on the Public Utilities Commission there.

His career in the printing industry and community service closely parallels that of friend and former fellow employee Garfield McGillivray, shop superintendent at The Herald, who completed his 45th year in the trade a few weeks ago.

Mrs. Baxter was a musician and for 33 years played piano in movie houses in the days of the silent movies. After coming to this area she was employed with Dornier Fine Papers.

She leaves one daughter, Mrs. Bernie Robson, 7 Lane Court, three grandsons, Dan, Bill and Ed., and one great-grandson, David.

A funeral and committal service took place at the McClure-Jones Funeral Home on January 11, conducted by Rev. Kelvin Johnston. Cremation followed.

The Cosburn family were pioneer settlers from England who settled in the Todmorden area of Toronto. Cosburn Avenue in the city bears the family name.

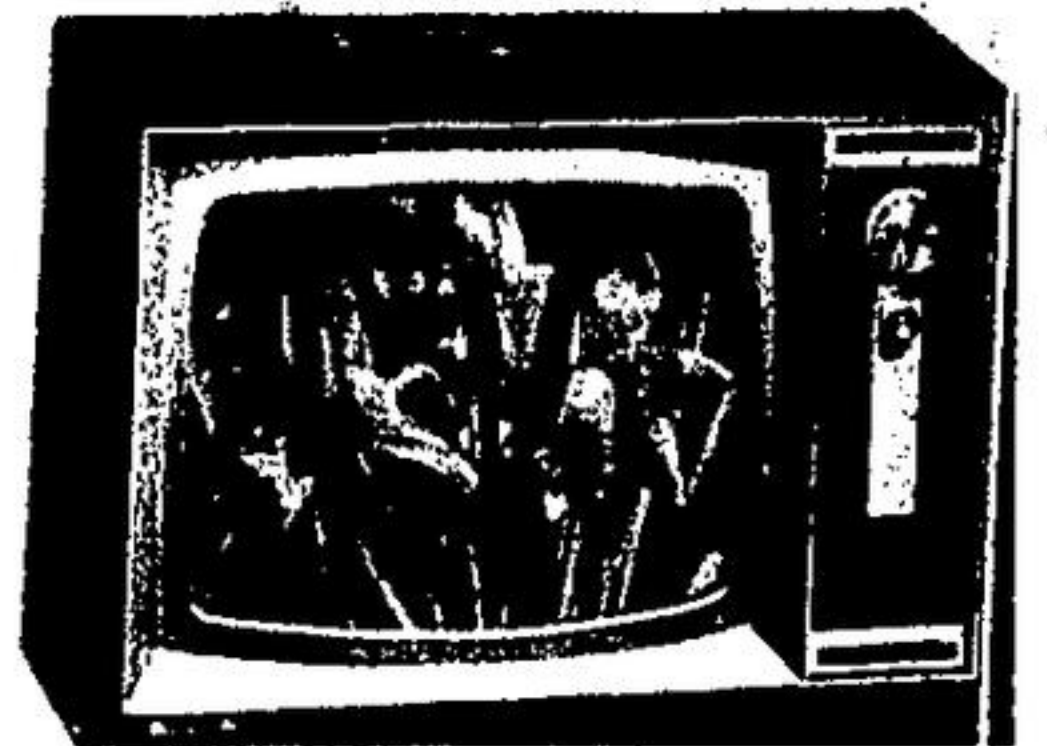

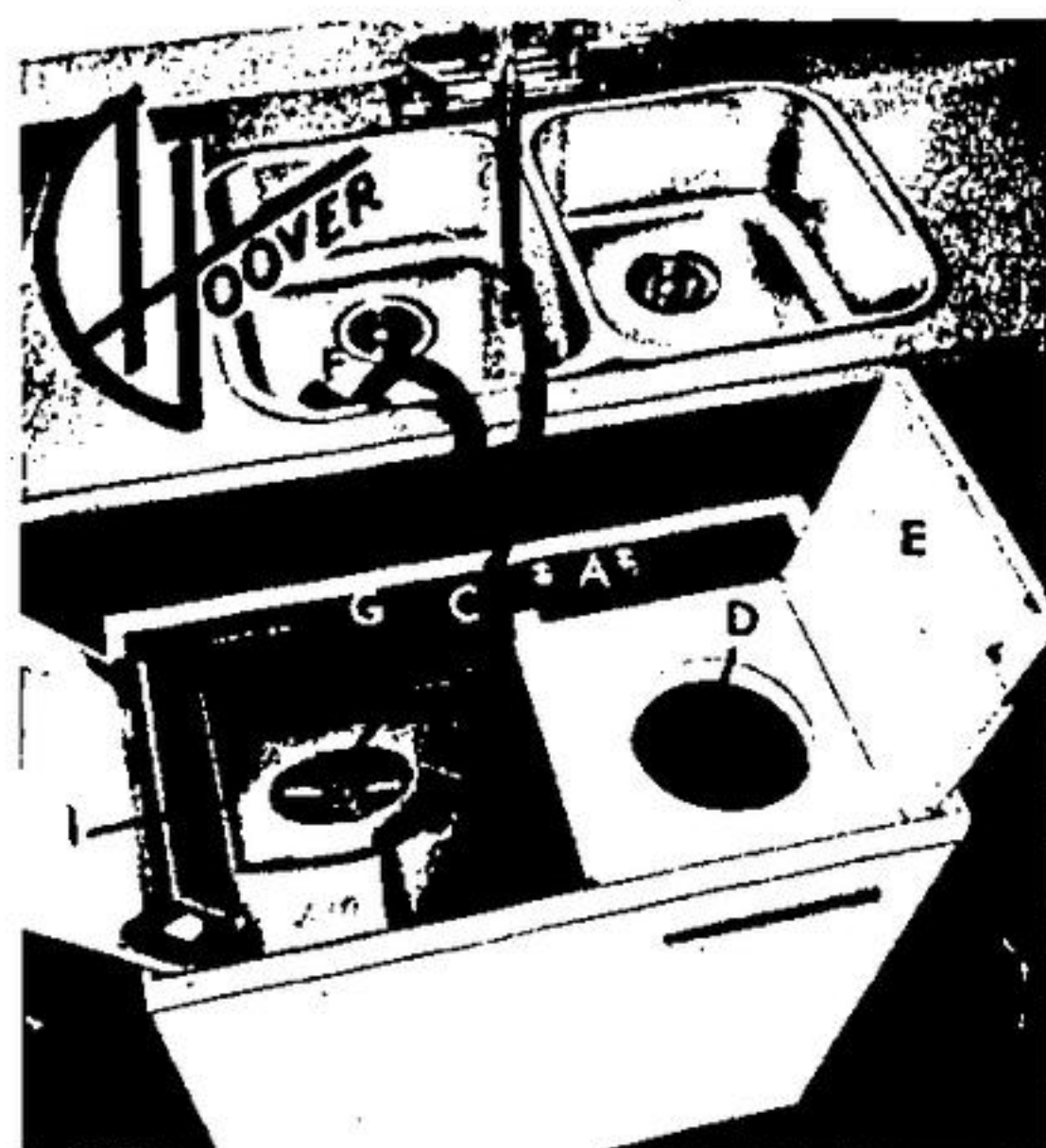
