

Raiders Head Into Toughest Week-End Meet Brantford Twice in Three Nights

This coming weekend is the toughest of the OHA Niagara Peninsula Intermediate A League's 1971-72 campaign as far as Georgetown's North Halton Raiders are concerned.

Raiders, who have developed into an irresistible force when their bench is full, will meet the perennial immovable object twice in three days when they tackle first place Brantford in Brantford Friday night and in the Memorial Arena Sunday night.

The always-powerful pace setters loaned first place to Welland Marauders for a few weeks but have since reclaimed it.

Raiders have been on the up elevator for the past month and a half, mainly because of new personnel with impressive credentials, and this double-barrelled shot at Brantford is the test coach Gerry Inglis has been waiting for.

SCATTERED
A 10-0 loss to the same club last time they met can be tossed out because it was on Boxing Day and all but four of the Raiders regulars were scattered around the province visiting friends or returning to their homes in the case of the imports. Raiders brass tried earlier in December to have that one rescheduled but without success.

A truer picture of the new Raiders was painted here January 14 when they came nose-to-nose with Welland Marauders, who were in first place at the time, and stopped them 4-2.

IN SHAPE
Carl Hymers, who has been working himself into shape, announced to Port Colborne here Friday night that he is in form by scoring four times to lead his mates to a 9-1 shellacking of the Port Colborne visitors.

Another 600 plus crowd watched this one and saw Steve Blundy, Blake Inglis, Paul Robinson, Ron Lane and Duffy McCarthy add singletons.

Hymers scored twice and Blake Inglis once in Fort Erie Tuesday January 19 when holes in the Georgetown line-up helped the Fort gain a 6-3 victory.

PRESIDENT DRESSED
Just nine Raiders went to Durham on Sunday for an interlocking game with Durham Huskies of the Georgian Bay loop which ended 6-3 for the home club. Results and scoring statistics in interlocking games between Georgian Bay and Niagara Peninsula teams don't count for the latter.

Raider club president Bill McCormack suited up for this one to bolster the Georgetown blue-line brigade which was shy three players.

A panel of spectators is selecting a Raider Player of the Week every week and made Carl Hymers their most recent choice. Their first pick, two weeks ago was defenseman Bill Currie. Players elected receive Silver's Department Store vouchers.

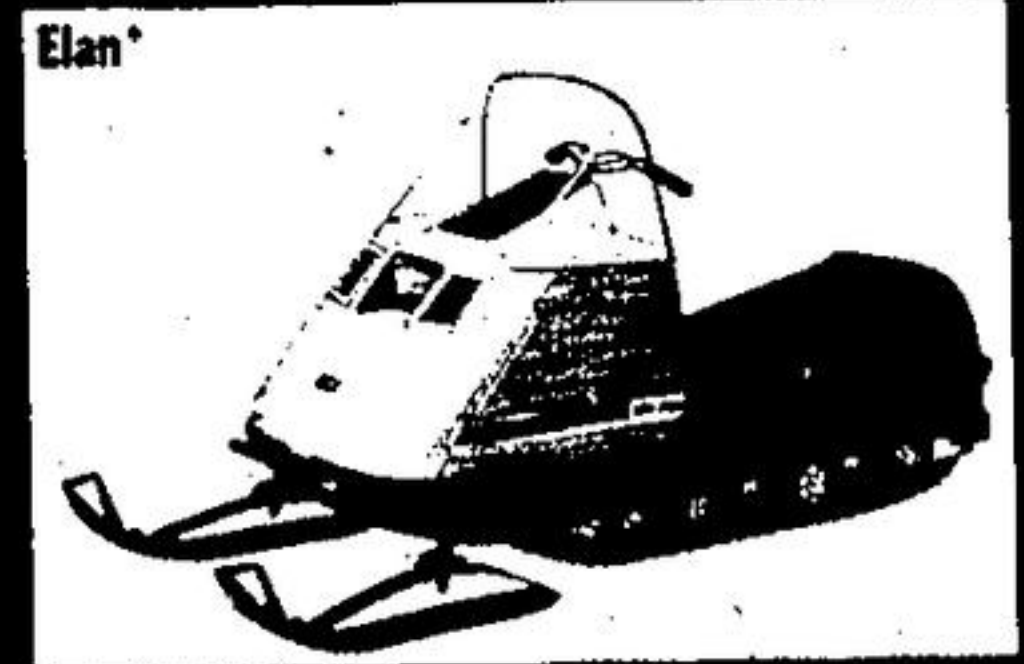
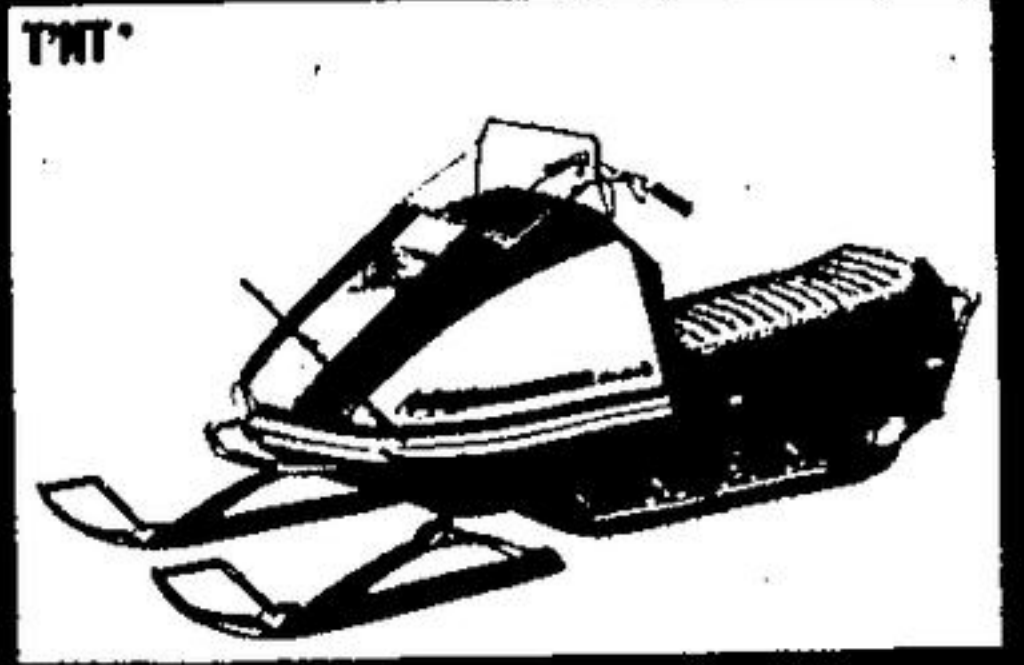
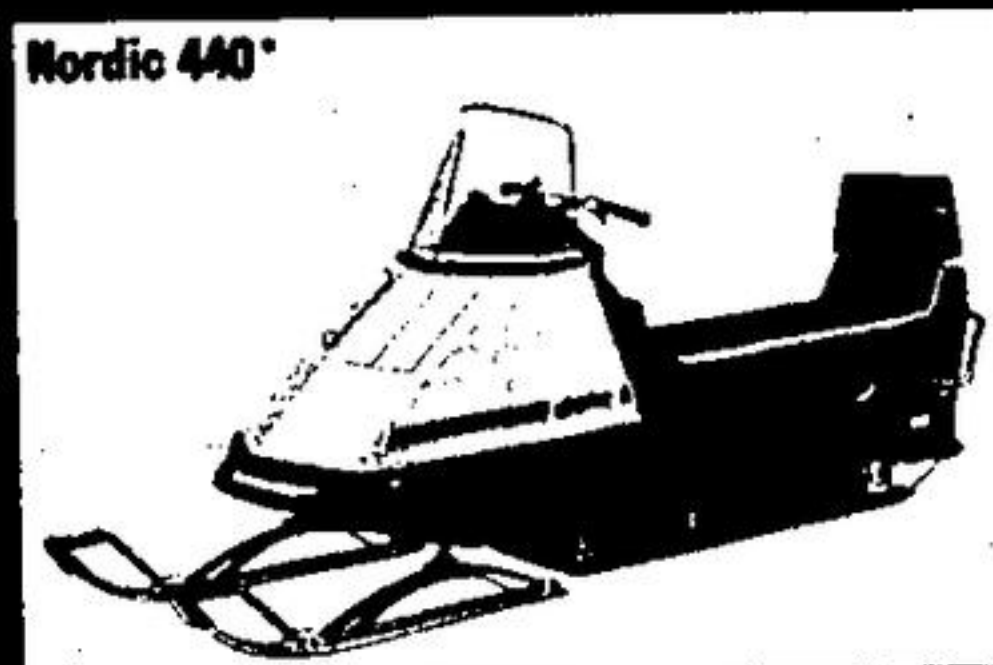
