

Board Never Nixed Contest Bodnar Tells Esquing

Halton County Board of Education did not prevent any grade five students from entering a fire prevention poster contest, last year, and in fact gave them permission to do so, a letter from Ernie Bodnar, chairman of Halton County Board of Education told Esquing council Monday night.

He concurred by reminding council their incorrect information could have been cleared up by a phone call.

Two weeks ago Esquing council endorsed a motion from

Oakville council strongly criticizing the Board's alleged action in banning the poster competition. At the time Cr. Dick Howitt said the art director felt a competition like this was unhealthy for the children.

Bodnar quoted from two letters one from letters written by E. T. Thorndyke, co-ordinator of creative arts, and P. J. Campbell, secretary of the Fire Prevention Bureau. Bodnar pointed out that Thorndyke, the man ostensibly blamed for

Kenneth Blair Sworn in Halton's Newest Judge

A former Guelph barrister is now a judge of the county and district courts of Ontario as a result of swearing-in ceremonies held in Milton, Friday.

J. Kenneth Blair, a Queen's Counsel, was appointed a judge effective December 23, and Friday's ceremony marked his official induction to the bench.

His appointment makes him a judge at large and he can, in effect, preside at county and district courts anywhere in Ontario.

However, his principal designation is for Halton County and his chambers will be in the county court house at Milton.

In addition to being a county and district court judge, he is now a surrogate court judge and local master of the Supreme Court of Ontario.

Friday's ceremonies were witnessed by a host of provincial, local and judicial dignitaries.

On hand were county court judges from Districts 2 and 3, which includes Halton County, members of the Halton bar, crown attorney Douglas Latimer, Murray Haesler of the Halton Law Association, T. Marshall of the Canadian Bar Association, and the chief county judges of Ontario.

Also in attendance were Halton MP Rud Whiting, Halton East MPP and minister of public works Jim Snow, and George Kerr, minister of colleges and universities and MPP for Halton West, Halton County warden Jim Swanborough was also there, along with representatives of county council, including reeve Allan Masson and deputy reeve Harry Barrett of Oakville.

In his acceptance remarks, Blair expressed confidence in the Canadian adversary system of justice.

NO CONTEST
He recommended the money prizes, customary in the past, either be channelled back to charity or abandoned and recognition given through a display in the schools with the firemen in attendance.

According to Bodnar, the reply from Campbell to this letter stated the Bureau was not holding the competition this year, but individual schools might do so on their own.

Quoting again, this time from a memo to all Oakville public schools from the art co-ordinator, Bodnar's letter said the fire prevention week poster painting could be part of the regular art programme, and the finished posters displayed, in stores, then be sent to the fire department. Firemen would then come and give Junior Firemen wallet cards to all the children.

The Board chairman's letter ended by saying, "Sorry council accepted such incorrect information when a phone call would have cleared up the matter."

The only comment made by Esquing council, was Cr. Dick Howitt's "You'll never convince Chief Dick Clements, of Milton."
