> Male - \$4.00 Female - \$8.00 Spayed female - \$4.00 (Certificate of Veterinarian required)


All owners of dogs should note that on or before the 30th day of April in each year, they are required to pay to the Collector, Mr. A. Duguay, the required licence fee.

There is a fine of \$50.00, exclusive of costs for a contravention of the above.

Owners of dogs should also note that any dog found running at large within the boundaries of the Town of Georgetown may be selzed and Impounded for a period of at least seventy-two hours and, If not redeemed upon payment of the prescribed licence fee and costs, may be sold or may be destroyed.
