**Businessman Here For Over 25 Years**

A Georgetown businessman since 1945, Lester Frederick (Fat) Vance, 30 Churchill Crescent, died in Princess Margaret Hospital, Toronto, February 9, following a lengthy illness. He was 58.

He learned the butchering trade in Orangeville with Mr. Stinton, came to Georgetown to join the staff of Buck's Fine Foods, with the late Clarence Buck, and after service with the RCAF during World War II, he returned to Georgetown to become a partner in operating the store.

He was a member of Orion Odd Fellows Lodge, the Lions Club and St. John's United Church, and an avid gardener and fisherman.

Born in Melancthon Township, he was the son of the late Archibald and Minnie Hayes Vance. He attended school in Corbett and at the Maples, near Orangeville, where his family moved in 1921, and then was an Orangeville resident until moving here.

He leaves his wife, Margaret Teeter, one daughter Margaret,

  - Spayed female - \$4.00
- (Certificate of Veterinarian required)

All owners of dogs should note that on or before the 30th day of April in each year, they are required to pay to the Collector, Mr. A. Duguay, the required licence fee.

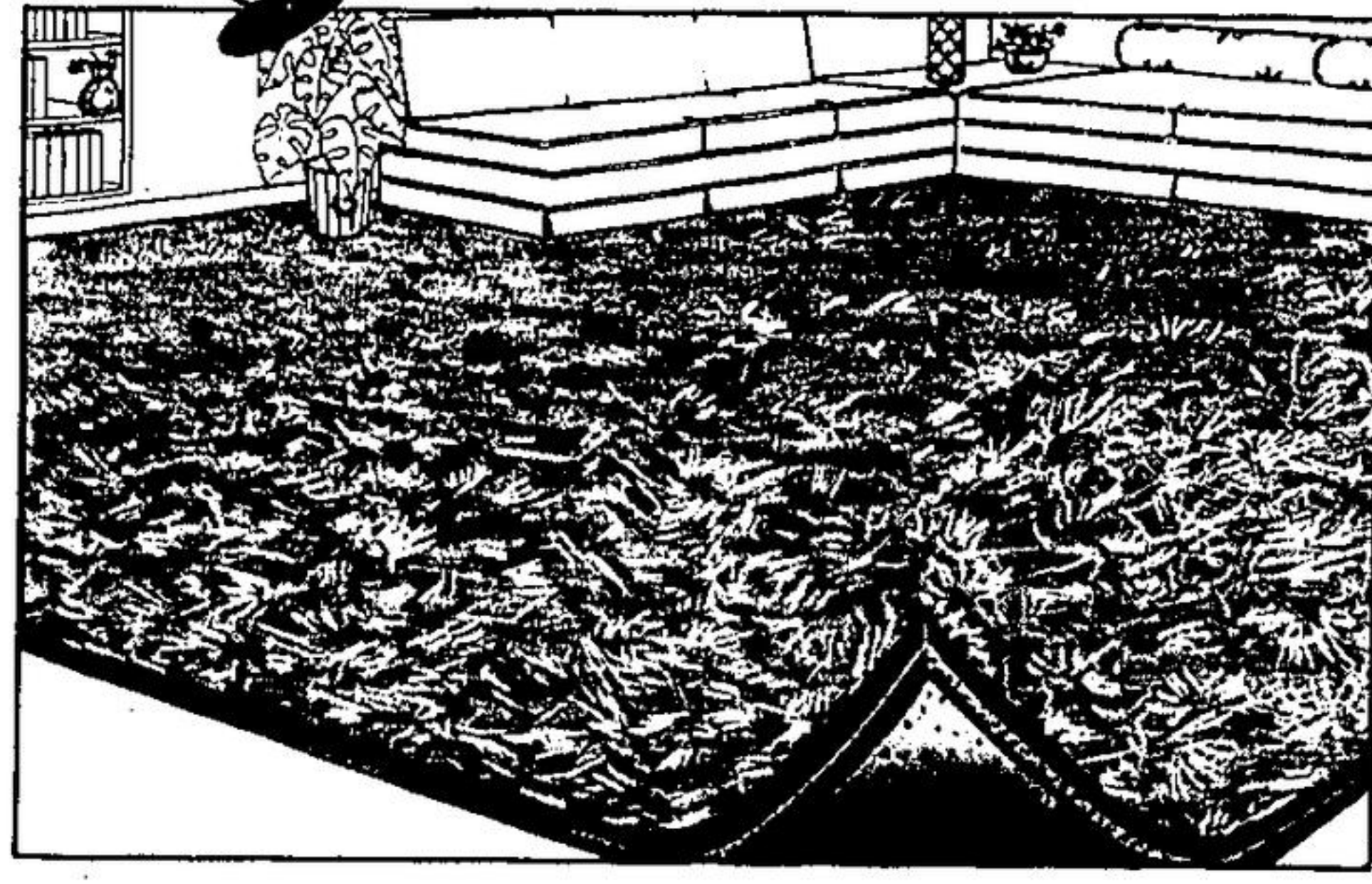
There is a fine of \$50.00, exclusive of costs for a contravention of the above.
