

Record 78 Teams Applied to Play in Bantam Tournament

More Bantam hockey teams than ever before have applied to take part in the 12th annual International Bantam Hockey Tournament to be held here March 18-25.

At press time the sponsoring Kinsmen have had 78 requests, however they can accommodate just 44 teams and the successful applicants were determined months ago.

The rest of the names have been placed on a standby list which is often drawn from because some entries have to bow out to stay in OMHA playoffs.

Since the first draft of the 1972 Bantam tournament schedule was drawn up there has already been switches. Dorset Park replaced Burlington, and Woodstock was moved into Owen Sound's spot.

FIRST-TIMERS

Both those clubs have competed before, however there will be three first-timers among the entries - Buffalo, Waterloo, Pickering, Petrolia and Don Mills.

All four division championship winners in 1971, Toronto Young Nats, Riverside, West Ferris and Coppercliff, will be back.

The Buffalo entry brings to four the number of teams coming from south of the border. The others are East Rochester, Detroit Gilco and Detroit L.C. Detroit will also be represented by two referees this year. Both are 19 and have attended the NHL's refereeing school just prior to the 1971-72 season.

TOTAL GOALS

The 44 teams taking part are divided into four categories according to population and each

will play an opponent twice with total goals the deciding factor.

As in past tournaments, division champions play each other on the final day to determine a Grand Champion in the tournament's 79th game.

While the teams are here they will receive two free meals a day will be billeted with local families and will generally be treated like ambassadors from their communities.

OFFER HELP

In addition to the members of the Kinsmen and Kinette clubs the tournament also has the assistance of the Georgetown Referees Association, referees from the area, The Georgetown Recreation Committee, town council, merchants, Legion Branch 120, other service clubs, many women's organizations, volunteer individuals and the

many homeowners who offer accommodation and breakfast to the visitors. Billets are still being sought.

An official opening on Friday evening March 17 will be preceded by a Tyke hockey exhibition game, and a grudge match between the Georgetown Referees Association Zebras and the Kinsmen-Legion All-Stars.

EIGHT TWINS

Some statistical digging by tournament chairman Harry Levy has produced some interesting "relative" facts. Thirty teams have fathers either coaching or managing their sons; 17 teams have brother combinations; and four teams include sets of twins in their lineups just to thoroughly confuse the opposition.
